HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 479

Celebrating the life of Charles Francis Curtis.

WHEREAS, Charlie Curtis will be fondly remembered for his integrity and his devotion to his family and community and will be greatly missed by his wife, Janie Curtis; his three sons, Randolph "Randy" Curtis and wife Patricia, Charles W. "Chuck" Curtis and wife Regina, David Ray Curtis and wife Pam; his two daughters, Fran Curtis Johnson and husband Gray and Ann Curtis Scarce and husband Donnie; his brothers and sister; his grandchildren and great-grandchildren; and many other relatives and friends; now, therefore, be it
