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### VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

An Act to amend and reenact §§ 63.2-1706 and 63.2-1728 of the Code of Virginia, relating to licensure of a facility; interview with residents or participants.

## 6 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

7 1. That §§ 63.2-1706 and 63.2-1728 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows:
 § 63.2-1706. Inspections and interviews.

9 A. Applicants for licensure and licensees shall at all times afford the Commissioner reasonable 10 opportunity to inspect all of their facilities, books and records, and to interview their agents and employees and any person living or participating in such facilities, or under their custody, control, 11 direction or supervision. Interviews conducted pursuant to this section with persons living or participating in a facility operated by or under the custody, control, direction, or supervision of an 12 13 applicant for licensure or a licensee shall be (i) authorized by the person to be interviewed or his 14 15 legally authorized representative and (ii) limited to discussion of issues related to the applicant's or licensee's compliance with applicable laws and regulations, including ascertaining if assessments and 16 17 reassessments of residents' cognitive and physical needs are performed as required under regulations of 18 the Board.

19 B. For any assisted living facility or adult day care center issued a license or renewal thereof for a 20 period of six months, the Commissioner shall make at least two inspections during the six-month period, one of which shall be unannounced. For any assisted living facility or adult day care center issued a 21 license or renewal thereof for a period of one year, the Commissioner shall make at least three 22 23 inspections each year, at least two of which shall be unannounced. For any assisted living facility or 24 adult day care center issued a license or a renewal thereof for a period of two years, the Commissioner 25 shall make at least two inspections each year, at least one of which shall be unannounced. For any 26 assisted living facility or adult day care center issued a three-year license, the Commissioner shall make 27 at least one inspection each year, which shall be unannounced.

For any assisted living facility issued a license or renewal thereof for a period of six months, the Commissioner shall make at least two inspections during the six-month period, one of which shall be unannounced. For any assisted living facility issued a license or renewal thereof for a period of one, two, or three years, the Commissioner shall make at least one inspection each year, which shall be unannounced, and as needed based on compliance with applicable laws and regulations.

C. All licensed child welfare agencies shall be inspected not less than twice annually, and one ofthose inspections shall be unannounced.

D. The activities, services and facilities of each applicant for renewal of his license as an assisted
 living facility, adult day care center or child welfare agency shall be subject to an inspection or
 examination by the Commissioner to determine if he is in compliance with current regulations of the
 Board or Child Day-Care Council, whichever is applicable.

E. For any licensed assisted living facility, adult day care center or child welfare agency, the
 Commissioner may authorize such other announced or unannounced inspections as the Commissioner
 considers appropriate.

42 § 63.2-1728. Establishment of toll-free telephone line for complaints; investigation on receipt of
 43 complaints.

With such funds as are appropriated for this purpose, the Commissioner shall establish a toll-free 44 45 telephone line to respond to complaints regarding operations of assisted living facilities, adult day care centers and child welfare agencies. Upon receipt of a complaint concerning the operation of an assisted 46 living facility, adult day care center or child welfare agency, regardless of whether the program is 47 48 subject to licensure, the Commissioner shall, for good cause shown, cause an investigation to be made, 49 including on-site visits as he deems necessary, of the activities, services, records and facilities. The 50 assisted living facility, adult day care center or child welfare agency shall afford the Commissioner reasonable opportunity to inspect all of the operator's activities, services, records and facilities and to 51 interview its agents and employees and any child or other person within its custody or control. 52 53 Whenever an assisted living facility, adult day care center or child welfare agency subject to inspection 54 under this section is determined by the Commissioner to be in noncompliance with the provisions of this 55 subtitle or with regulations adopted pursuant to this subtitle, the Commissioner shall give reasonable 56 notice to the assisted living facility, adult day care center or child welfare agency of the nature of its

57 noncompliance and may thereafter take appropriate action as provided by law, including a suit to enjoin58 the operation of the assisted living facility, adult day care center or child welfare agency.

59 An incident report filed by an assisted living facility, pursuant to regulations adopted by the Board, 60 for any major incident that negatively affects or threatens the life, health, safety, or welfare of any

61 resident of the facility shall not be considered a complaint for purposes of this section and shall not be

62 posted by the Department on a website maintained by the Department. However, upon receipt of an

63 incident report for any major incident that negatively affects or threatens the life, health, safety, or 64 welfare of any resident of an assisted living facility, the Commissioner may initiate an investigation

65 including an on-site visit to the facility if the Commissioner finds, for good cause shown based upon the

66 seriousness of the incident and the nature of any response to the incident, including any implementation 67 of a plan of correction to address the situation giving rise to the incident, that an investigation is

68 required to protect the life, health, safety, or welfare of a resident of the assisted living facility.
69 2. That by November 1, 2010, the Department of Social Services shall, in consultation with key

69 2. That by November 1, 2010, the Department of Social Services shall, in consultation with key 70 stakeholder groups, develop specific criteria by which the Department issues one-, two-, and

71 three-year assisted living facility licenses. Such criteria shall be separately stated for each licensure 72 period and shall be unambiguously communicated to all entities seeking initial and renewal

72 period and shan be unambiguously communicated to an entities seeking initial and 73 licenses.
