That § 2.2-3705.2 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 11 12 § 2.2-3705.2. Exclusions to application of chapter; records relating to public safety. 13 The following records are excluded from the provisions of this chapter but may be disclosed by the 14 custodian in his discretion, except where such disclosure is prohibited by law: 1. Confidential records, including victim identity, provided to or obtained by staff in a rape crisis 15 16 center or a program for battered spouses. 2. Those portions of engineering and construction drawings and plans submitted for the sole purpose 17 of complying with the Building Code in obtaining a building permit that would identify specific trade 18 secrets or other information, the disclosure of which would be harmful to the competitive position of the 19 20 owner or lessee. However, such information shall be exempt only until the building is completed. 21 Information relating to the safety or environmental soundness of any building shall not be exempt from 22 disclosure. 23 Those portions of engineering and construction drawings and plans that reveal critical structural 24 components, security equipment and systems, ventilation systems, fire protection equipment, mandatory 25 building emergency equipment or systems, elevators, electrical systems, telecommunications equipment and systems, and other utility equipment and systems submitted for the purpose of complying with the 26 27 Uniform Statewide Building Code (§ 36-97 et seq.) or the Statewide Fire Prevention Code (§ 27-94 et 28 seq.), the disclosure of which would jeopardize the safety or security of any public or private 29 commercial office, multifamily residential or retail building or its occupants in the event of terrorism or 30 other threat to public safety, to the extent that the owner or lessee of such property, equipment or 31 system in writing (i) invokes the protections of this paragraph; (ii) identifies the drawings, plans, or other materials to be protected; and (iii) states the reasons why protection is necessary. 32 Nothing in this subdivision shall prevent the disclosure of information relating to any building in 33 34 connection with an inquiry into the performance of that building after it has been subjected to fire, 35 explosion, natural disaster or other catastrophic event. 36 3. Documentation or other information that describes the design, function, operation or access control 37 features of any security system, whether manual or automated, which is used to control access to or use 38 of any automated data processing or telecommunications system. 39 4. Plans and information to prevent or respond to terrorist activity, the disclosure of which would 40 jeopardize the safety of any person, including (i) critical infrastructure sector or structural components; (ii) vulnerability assessments, operational, procedural, transportation, and tactical planning or training 41 manuals, and staff meeting minutes or other records; and (iii) engineering or architectural records, or 42 records containing information derived from such records, to the extent such records reveal the location 43 or operation of security equipment and systems, elevators, ventilation, fire protection, emergency, 44 electrical, telecommunications or utility equipment and systems of any public building, structure or 45 46 information storage facility, or telecommunications or utility equipment or systems. The same categories 47 of records of any governmental or nongovernmental person or entity submitted to a public body for the purpose of antiterrorism response planning may be withheld from disclosure if such person or entity in 48 49 writing (a) invokes the protections of this subdivision, (b) identifies with specificity the records or portions thereof for which protection is sought, and (c) states with reasonable particularity why the 50 51 protection of such records from public disclosure is necessary to meet the objective of antiterrorism 52 planning or protection. Such statement shall be a public record and shall be disclosed upon request. 53 Nothing in this subdivision shall be construed to prohibit the disclosure of records relating to the structural or environmental soundness of any building, nor shall it prevent the disclosure of information 54 55 relating to any building in connection with an inquiry into the performance of that building after it has been subjected to fire, explosion, natural disaster or other catastrophic event. 56 57 5. Information that would disclose the security aspects of a system safety program plan adopted 58 pursuant to 49 C.F.R. Part 659 by the Commonwealth's designated Rail Fixed Guideway Systems Safety

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59 Oversight agency; and information in the possession of such agency, the release of which would 60 jeopardize the success of an ongoing investigation of a rail accident or other incident threatening railway 61 safety.

62 6. Engineering and architectural drawings, operational, procedural, tactical planning or training 63 manuals, or staff meeting minutes or other records, the disclosure of which would reveal surveillance 64 techniques, personnel deployments, alarm or security systems or technologies, or operational and 65 transportation plans or protocols, to the extent such disclosure would jeopardize the security of any 66 governmental facility, building or structure or the safety of persons using such facility, building or 67 structure.

68 7. Security plans and specific assessment components of school safety audits, as provided in 69 § 22.1-279.8.

Nothing in this subdivision shall be construed to prohibit the disclosure of records relating to the 70 71 effectiveness of security plans after (i) any school building or property has been subjected to fire, 72 explosion, natural disaster or other catastrophic event, or (ii) any person on school property has suffered 73 or been threatened with any personal injury. 74

75 9. Records of the Commitment Review Committee concerning the mental health assessment of an 76 individual subject to commitment as a sexually violent predator under Chapter 9 (§ 37.2-900 et seq.) of 77 Title 37.2; except that in no case shall records identifying the victims of a sexually violent predator be 78 disclosed.

79 10. Subscriber data, which for the purposes of this subdivision, means the name, address, telephone 80 number, and any other information identifying a subscriber of a telecommunications carrier, provided 81 directly or indirectly by a telecommunications carrier to a public body that operates a 911 or E-911 emergency dispatch system or an emergency notification or reverse 911 system, if the data is in a form 82 83 not made available by the telecommunications carrier to the public generally. Nothing in this subdivision shall prevent the release of subscriber data generated in connection with specific calls to a 911 84 85 emergency system, where the requester is seeking to obtain public records about the use of the system 86 in response to a specific crime, emergency or other event as to which a citizen has initiated a 911 call.

87 11. Subscriber data, which for the purposes of this subdivision, means the name, address, telephone 88 number, and any other information identifying a subscriber of a telecommunications carrier, collected by 89 a local governing body in accordance with the Enhanced Public Safety Telephone Services Act 90 (§ 56-484.12 et seq.), and other identifying information of a personal, medical, or financial nature 91 provided to a local governing body in connection with a 911 or E-911 emergency dispatch system or an 92 emergency notification or reverse 911 system, if such records are not otherwise publicly available. 93 Nothing in this subdivision shall prevent the release of subscriber data generated in connection with specific calls to a 911 emergency system, where the requester is seeking to obtain public records about 94 95 the use of the system in response to a specific crime, emergency or other event as to which a citizen has 96 initiated a 911 call.

97 12. Records of the Virginia Military Advisory Council, the Virginia National Defense Industrial 98 Authority, or a local or regional military affairs organization appointed by a local governing body, to the 99 extent such records (i) contain information relating to strategies under consideration or development by 100 the Council, the Authority, or such organizations to prevent the closure or realignment of federal 101 military installations located in Virginia, to limit the adverse economic effect of such realignment or 102 closure, or to seek additional tenant activity growth from the Department of Defense or (ii) disclose trade secrets, as defined in the Uniform Trade Secrets Act (§ 59.1-336 et seq.), provided to the Council, 103 104 the Authority, or such organizations in connection with their work. In order to invoke the trade secret 105 protection provided by clause (ii), the submitting entity shall, in writing and at the time of submission (a) invoke this exclusion, (b) identify with specificity the information for which such protection is 106 107 sought, and (c) state the reason why such protection is necessary. Nothing in this subdivision shall be 108 construed to authorize the withholding of all or part of any record, other than a trade secret that has 109 been specifically identified as required by this subdivision, after the Department of Defense has issued a 110 final, unappealable decision, or in the event of litigation, a court of competent jurisdiction has entered a 111 final, unappealable order concerning the closure, realignment, or expansion of the military installation or 112 tenant activities for which records are sought.

113 13. Documentation or other information as determined by the State Comptroller that describes the 114 design, function, operation, or implementation of internal controls over the Commonwealth's financial 115 processes and systems, and the assessment of risks and vulnerabilities of those controls, including the 116 annual assessment of internal controls mandated by the State Comptroller, the disclosure of which would jeopardize the security of the Commonwealth's financial assets. However, records relating to the 117 investigation of and findings concerning the soundness of any fiscal process shall be disclosed in a form 118 119 that does not compromise internal controls. Nothing in this subdivision shall be construed to prohibit the 120 Auditor of Public Accounts or the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission from reporting 121 internal control deficiencies discovered during the course of an audit.

122 14. Documentation or other information that (i) describes the design, function, programming, 123 operation, or access control features of the overall system, components, structures, individual networks, 124 and subsystems of the Statewide Agencies Radio System (STARS) or (ii) relates to radio frequencies 125 assigned to or utilized by STARS, code plugs, circuit routing, addressing schemes, talk groups, fleet 126 maps, encryption, programming maintained by or utilized by STARS; those portions of engineering and 127 construction drawings and plans that reveal critical structural components, interconnectivity, security 128 equipment and systems, network monitoring, network operation center, master sites, ventilation systems, 129 fire protection equipment, mandatory building emergency equipment, electrical systems, and other utility 130 equipment and systems related to STARS; and special event plans, operational plans, storm plans, or 131 other pre-arranged programming, the disclosure of which would reveal surveillance techniques, 132 personnel deployments, alarm or security systems or technologies, or operational and transportation 133 plans or protocols, to the extent such disclosure would jeopardize the security of any governmental 134 facility, building or structure or the safety of any person.
