5 6	(Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Herring) A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 23-276.1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the definition of
7	"vocational programs."
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That §§ 23-276.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
10	§ 23-276.1. Definitions.
11	As used in this chapter:
12 13	"Academic-Vocational" refers to a noncollege degree school that offers degree and nondegree credit
13 14	"Agent" means a person who is employed by any institution of higher education or noncollege
15	degree school, whether such institution or school is located within or outside the Commonwealth, to act
16	as an agent, solicitor, procurer, broker or independent contractor to procure students or enrollees for any
17	such institution or school by solicitation in any form at any place in the Commonwealth other than the
18	office or principal location of such institution or school.
19 20	"Certificate" or "diploma" means an award that is given for successful completion of a curriculum
20 21	comprised of courses that may also be taken for degree credit and shall apply only to those awards given for coursework offered by institutions of higher education and academic-vocational noncollege
$\overline{22}$	degree schools.
23	"College" means any institution of higher education that offers associate or baccalaureate level degree
24	programs.
25	"Continuing or professional education" means those classes, courses, and programs, designed
26 27	specifically for individuals who have completed a degree in a professional field, that (i) are intended to fulfill the continuing education requirements for licensure or certification in said profession; (ii) have
28	been approved by a legislatively or judicially established board or agency responsible for regulating the
29	practice of the profession; and (iii) are offered exclusively to an individual practicing in the profession.
30	"Council" means the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia.
31	"Degree" means any earned award at the associate, baccalaureate, graduate, first professional or
32 33	specialist levels that represents satisfactory completion of the requirements of a program or course of study or instruction beyond the secondary school level.
33 34	"Degree credit course" means any earned credits awarded for successful completion of the
35	requirements of a course of study or instruction beyond the secondary school level, which may be used
36	toward completion of a certificate or diploma, or an associate, baccalaureate, graduate, first professional
37	or specialist level degree.
38 39	"Fraudulent academic credential" means a diploma, certification, academic transcript, or other
40	document issued by a person or an entity that is not an institution of higher education that provides evidence of or demonstrates completion of course work or academic credit that results in the issuance of
41	an associate or more advanced degree.
42	"In-state institution" means an institution of higher education that is formed, chartered, or established
43	within Virginia. An out-of-state institution shall be deemed an in-state institution for the purposes of
44 45	certification as a degree-granting institution if (i) it has no instructional campus in the jurisdiction in which it was formed abortered actablished on incompared and (ii) it meduaes along and convinging
45 46	which it was formed, chartered, established, or incorporated and (ii) it produces clear and convincing evidence that its main or principal campus is located in Virginia.
47	"Institution of higher education" or "institution" means any person or entity, other than a Virginia
48	state-supported institution of higher education named in § 23-9.5 or any public institution of higher
49	education established in statute as an authority and declared a governmental instrumentality pursuant to
50	§ 23-14, that has received approval from the Council to (i) use the term "college" or "university," or
51 52	words of like meaning, in its name or in any manner in connection with its academic affairs or business;
52 53	(ii) enroll students; or (iii) offer approved courses for degree credit or programs of study leading to a degree or to offer degrees either at a site in Virginia or via telecommunications equipment located
54	within Virginia.
55	"Multistate compact" means any agreement involving two or more states to offer jointly
56	postsecondary educational opportunities, pursuant to policies and procedures set forth by such agreement
57 58	and approved by the Council. "Noncollege degree school" means any postsecondary school that offers courses or programs of study
50 59	that do not lead to an associate or higher level degree. Such schools may be academic-vocational or

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60 vocational.

61 "Nondegree credit course" means any earned credits awarded for successful completion of the
62 requirements of a course of study or instruction beyond the secondary school level, which may be used
63 toward completion of a certificate or diploma, but may not be used to earn an associate or higher level

64 degree.

65 "Out-of-state institution" means an institution of higher education that is formed, chartered, 66 established, or incorporated outside the Commonwealth.

67 "Postsecondary school" or "school" means any entity offering formal instructional programs with a 68 curriculum designed primarily for students who have completed the requirements for a high school 69 diploma or its equivalent. Such schools include programs of academic, vocational, and continuing 70 professional education, and exclude avocational and adult basic education programs. For the purposes of 71 this chapter, a "postsecondary school" shall be classified as either an institution of higher education as 72 defined in this section or a noncollege degree school, as defined in this section.

73 "Program" means a curriculum or course of study in a discipline or interdisciplinary area that leads74 to a degree, certificate, or diploma.

75 "Program area" means a general group of disciplines in which one or more degree programs, 76 certificates, or diplomas may be offered.

"Proprietary" means a privately owned and managed, profit-making institution of higher education or noncollege degree school.

"Site" means a location in Virginia where a postsecondary school (i) offers one or more courses on
an established schedule and (ii) enrolls two or more persons who are not members of the same
household. A site may be a branch of such postsecondary school, and shall not be required to possess
administrative capability.

"University" means any institution offering programs leading to degrees or degree credit beyond the
baccalaureate level.

85 "Vocational" refers to a noncollege degree school that offers only nondegree credit courses, and shall 86 not include instructional programs that are intended solely for recreation, enjoyment, personal interest,

87 or as a hobby, or courses or programs of instruction that prepare individuals to teach such pursuits.
