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9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That § 58.1-439.18 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
11	§ 58.1-439.18. Definitions.
12	As used in this article:
13	"Affiliate" means with respect to any person, any other person directly or indirectly controlling,
14	controlled by, or under common control with such person. For purposes of this definition, "control"
15	(including controlled by and under common control with) shall mean the power, directly or indirectly, to
16	direct or cause the direction of the management and policies of such person whether through ownership
17	or voting securities or by contract or otherwise.
18	"Business firm" means any corporation, partnership, electing small business (Subchapter S)
19	corporation, limited liability company, or sole proprietorship authorized to do business in this
20	Commonwealth subject to tax imposed by Articles 2 (§ 58.1-320 et seq.) and 10 (§ 58.1-400 et seq.) of
21	Chapter 3, Chapter 12 (§ 58.1-1200 et seq.), Article 1 (§ 58.1-2500 et seq.) of Chapter 25, or Article 2
22	(§ 58.1-2620 et seq.) of Chapter 26.
23	"Commissioner of the State Department of Social Services" means the Commissioner of the State
24	Department of Social Services or his designee.
25	"Community services" means any type of counseling and advice, emergency assistance, medical care,
26 27	provision of basic necessities, or services designed to minimize the effects of poverty, furnished
27 28	primarily to impoverished people. "Contracting services" means the provision, by a business firm licensed by the Commonwealth as a
20 29	contractor under Chapter 11 (§ 54.1-1100 et seq.) of Title 54.1, of labor or technical advice to aid in the
<b>3</b> 0	development, construction, renovation, or repair of (i) homes of impoverished people or (ii) buildings
31	used by neighborhood organizations.
32	"Education" means any type of scholastic instruction or scholastic assistance to an individual who is
33	impoverished.
34	"Housing assistance" means furnishing financial assistance, labor, material, or technical advice to aid
35	the physical improvement of the homes of impoverished people.
36	"Impoverished people" means individuals with family annual income not in excess of 180 200
37	percent of the current poverty guidelines for education proposals submitted to the Superintendent of
38	Public Instruction requesting an allocation of tax credits under this article. For other than education
39	proposals, impoverished people means individuals with family annual income not in excess of 150
40	percent of the current poverty guidelines.
41	"Job training" means any type of instruction to an individual who is impoverished that enables him
42	to acquire vocational skills so that he can become employable or able to seek a higher grade of
43	employment.
44	"Neighborhood assistance" means providing community services, education, housing assistance, or
45	job training.
46	"Neighborhood organization" means any local, regional or statewide organization whose primary
47	function is providing neighborhood assistance for impoverished people, and holding a ruling from the
48	Internal Revenue Service of the United States Department of the Treasury that the organization is
<b>49</b>	exempt from income taxation under the provisions of §§ $501(c)(3)$ and $501(c)(4)$ of the Internal Revenue
