63 8. Adopt regulations to implement certification programs required in § 2.2-1403.1 for small, 64 women-owned, and minority-owned businesses, which regulations shall be exempt from the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.) pursuant to subdivision B 2 of § 2.2-4002. Such 65 certification programs shall deny certification to vendors from states that deny like certifications to 66 Virginia-based small, women-owned or minority-owned businesses or that provide a preference for 67 small, women-owned, or minority-owned businesses based in that state that is not available to 68 Virginia-based businesses. The regulations shall (i) establish minimum requirements for certification of 69 70 small, women- and minority-owned businesses; (ii) provide a process for evaluating existing local, state, 71 private sector, and federal certification programs that meet the minimum requirements; and (iii) mandate certification, without any additional paperwork, of any prospective state vendor that has obtained 72 certification under any certification program that is determined to meet the minimum requirements 73 74 established in the regulations.

9. Establish an interdepartmental board in accordance with § 2.2-1404 to supply the Director with 75 information useful in promoting minority business activity. 76

§ 2.2-1403.1. Certification of small, women-owned, and minority-owned businesses; revocation of 77 78 certification.

79 A. The Director shall establish programs for the certification of small, women-owned, and 80 minority-owned businesses. 81

B. The regulations shall:

1. Establish minimum requirements for certification of small, women-owned, and minority-owned 82 83 businesses:

84 2. Provide a process for evaluating existing local, state, private sector, and federal certification 85 programs that meet the minimum requirements;

3. Mandate certification, without any additional paperwork, of any prospective state vendor that has 86 87 obtained certification under any certification program that is determined to meet the minimum 88 requirements established in the regulations; and

89 4. Deny certification to vendors from states that deny like certifications to Virginia-based small, 90 women-owned, or minority-owned businesses or that provide a preference for small, women-owned, or 91 minority-owned businesses based in that state that is not available to Virginia-based businesses.

92 C. If the Director determines that a business certified pursuant this section has violated the contract provision required by subsection D of § 2.2-4310, the certification of such business shall be revoked for a period of one year. After the one-year period, the business may reapply for certification. 93 94

95 § 2.2-4310. Discrimination prohibited; participation of small, women-, minority- and service disabled 96 veteran-owned business.

97 A. In the solicitation or awarding of contracts, no public body shall discriminate against a bidder or 98 offeror because of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age, disability, status as a service disabled 99 veteran, or any other basis prohibited by state law relating to discrimination in employment. Whenever 100 solicitations are made, each public body shall include businesses selected from a list made available by 101 the Department of Minority Business Enterprise.

102 B. All public bodies shall establish programs consistent with this chapter to facilitate the participation 103 of small businesses and businesses owned by women, minorities, and service disabled veterans in procurement transactions. The programs established shall be in writing and shall comply with the 104 provisions of any enhancement or remedial measures authorized by the Governor pursuant to subsection 105 C or, where applicable, by the chief executive of a local governing body pursuant to § 15.2-965.1, and 106 107 shall include specific plans to achieve any goals established therein. State agencies shall submit annual 108 progress reports on small, women- and minority-owned business procurement and on service disabled veteran-owned business procurement to the Department of Minority Business Enterprise in a form 109 specified by the Department of Minority Business Enterprise. The Department of Minority Business 110 Enterprise shall make information on service disabled veteran-owned procurement available to the 111 112 Department of Veterans Services upon request.

113 C. Whenever there exists (i) a rational basis for small business enhancement or (ii) a persuasive 114 analysis that documents a statistically significant disparity between the availability and utilization of 115 women-owned and minority-owned businesses, the Governor is authorized and encouraged to require state agencies to implement appropriate enhancement or remedial measures consistent with prevailing 116 law. Such enhancement or remedial measures shall require state agencies to solicit bids from all 117 qualified vendors and not be limited to bids submitted by businesses certified by the Department of Minority Business Enterprise pursuant to § 2.2-1403.1. Any enhancement or remedial measure 118 119 implemented pursuant to this section shall not exceed three percent of the total value of all vendor 120

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121 contracts calculated against the costs of accepting the lowest competent and qualifying bids.

122 D. In the solicitation or awarding of contracts with a small, women-owned, minority-owned, or 123 service disabled veteran-owned business, all public bodies shall include in every contract of more than 124 \$10,000 the following:

125 "During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees that no more than 60 percent of the 126 contracted work will be subcontracted to another contractor, except where (i) there is a bona fide 127 occupational qualification reasonably necessary to the normal operation of the contractor or (ii) such 128 contractor is the lowest responsible and responsive bidder. The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous 129 places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the provisions of this 130 clause. Notices, advertisements, and solicitations placed in accordance with federal law, rule, or 131 regulation shall be deemed sufficient posting."

E. In the solicitation or awarding of contracts, no state agency, department or institution shall
 discriminate against a bidder or offeror because the bidder or offeror employs ex-offenders unless the
 state agency, department or institution has made a written determination that employing ex-offenders on
 the specific contract is not in its best interest.

**136** E.F. As used in this section:

"Minority individual" means an individual who is a citizen of the United States or a legal residentalien and who satisfies one or more of the following definitions:

1. "African American" means a person having origins in any of the original peoples of Africa andwho is regarded as such by the community of which this person claims to be a part.

141 2. "Asian American" means a person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East,
142 Southeast Asia, the Indian subcontinent, or the Pacific Islands, including but not limited to Japan, China,
143 Vietnam, Samoa, Laos, Cambodia, Taiwan, Northern Mariana, the Philippines, a U.S. territory of the
144 Pacific, India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, or Sri Lanka and who is regarded as such by the community of
145 which this person claims to be a part.

146 3. "Hispanic American" means a person having origins in any of the Spanish-speaking peoples of
147 Mexico, South or Central America, or the Caribbean Islands or other Spanish or Portuguese cultures and
148 who is regarded as such by the community of which this person claims to be a part.

4. "Native American" means a person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America and who is regarded as such by the community of which this person claims to be a part or who is recognized by a tribal organization.

152 "Minority-owned business" means a business that is at least 51% 51 percent owned by one or more 153 minority individuals who are U.S. citizens or legal resident aliens, or in the case of a corporation, 154 partnership, or limited liability company or other entity, at least 51% 51 percent of the equity ownership 155 interest in the corporation, partnership, or limited liability company or other entity is owned by one or 156 more minority individuals who are U.S. citizens or legal resident aliens, and both the management and 157 daily business operations are controlled by one or more minority individuals.

"Service disabled veteran" means a veteran who (i) served on active duty in the United States
military ground, naval, or air service, (ii) was discharged or released under conditions other than
dishonorable, and (iii) has a service-connected disability rating fixed by the United States Department of
Veterans Affairs.

162 "Service disabled veteran business" means a business that is at least 51% 51 percent owned by one 163 or more service disabled veterans or, in the case of a corporation, partnership, or limited liability 164 company or other entity, at least 51% 51 percent of the equity ownership interest in the corporation, 165 partnership, or limited liability company or other entity is owned by one or more individuals who are 166 service disabled veterans and both the management and daily business operations are controlled by one 167 or more individuals who are service disabled veterans.

"Small business" means a business, independently owned and controlled by one or more individuals
who are U.S. citizens or legal resident aliens, and together with affiliates, has 250 or fewer employees,
or annual gross receipts of \$10 million or less averaged over the previous three years. One or more of
the individual owners shall control both the management and daily business operations of the small
business.

173 "State agency" means any authority, board, department, instrumentality, institution, agency, or other174 unit of state government. "State agency" shall not include any county, city, or town.

175 "Women-owned business" means a business that is at least 51% 51 percent owned by one or more 176 women who are U.S. citizens or legal resident aliens, or in the case of a corporation, partnership, or 177 limited liability company or other entity, at least 51% 51 percent of the equity ownership interest is 178 owned by one or more women who are U.S. citizens or legal resident aliens, and both the management 179 and daily business operations are controlled by one or more women.

180 § 15.2-965.1. Participation of small, women-, and minority-owned businesses.

181 A. Any locality may enact an ordinance providing that whenever there exists (i) a rational basis for

small business enhancement, or (ii) a persuasive analysis that documents a statistically significant
disparity between the availability and utilization of women- and minority-owned businesses, the chief
executive of the local governing entity shall be authorized and encouraged to require implementation of
appropriate enhancement and remedial measures consistent with prevailing law.

186 B. A small, women-owned, or minority-owned business that is certified by the Department of Minority Business Enterprises pursuant to \$ 2.2-1403 § 2.2-1403.1 shall not be required by any locality to obtain any additional certification to participate in any program designed to enhance the participation of such businesses as vendors or to remedy any documented disparity.
