2 *An Act to amend and reenact § 46.2-817 of the Code of Virginia, relating to disregarding signal by*  
3 *law-enforcement to stop; penalty.*

6 **Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:**7 **1. That § 46.2-817 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:**

8 § 46.2-817. Disregarding signal by law-enforcement officer to stop; eluding police; penalties.

9 A. Any person who, having received a visible or audible signal from any law-enforcement officer to  
10 bring his motor vehicle to a stop, drives such motor vehicle in a willful and wanton disregard of such  
11 signal or who attempts to escape or elude such law-enforcement officer *whether on foot, in the vehicle,*  
12 *or by any other means*, is guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor. It shall be an affirmative defense to a  
13 charge of a violation of this subsection if the defendant shows he reasonably believed he was being  
14 pursued by a person other than a law-enforcement officer.

15 B. Any person who, having received a visible or audible signal from any law-enforcement officer to  
16 bring his motor vehicle to a stop, drives such motor vehicle in a willful and wanton disregard of such  
17 signal so as to interfere with or endanger the operation of the law-enforcement vehicle or endanger a  
18 person is guilty of a Class 6 felony. It shall be an affirmative defense to a charge of a violation of this  
19 subsection if the defendant shows he reasonably believed he was being pursued by a person other than a  
20 law-enforcement officer.

21 C. If a law-enforcement officer pursues a person as a result of a violation of subsection B and the  
22 law-enforcement officer is killed as a direct and proximate result of the pursuit, the person who violated  
23 subsection B is guilty of a Class 4 felony.

24 D. When any person is convicted of an offense under this section, in addition to the other penalties  
25 provided in this section, the driver's license of such person shall be suspended by the court for a period  
26 of not less than thirty days nor more than one year. However, in any case where the speed of such  
27 person is determined to have exceeded the maximum allowed by twenty miles per hour, his driver's  
28 license shall be suspended by the court trying the case for a period of not less than ninety days. In case  
29 of conviction and suspension, the court or judge shall order the surrender of the license to the court,  
30 which shall dispose of it in accordance with the provisions of § 46.2-398.

31 E. Violation of this section shall constitute a separate and distinct offense. If the acts or activities  
32 violating this section also violate another provision of law, a prosecution under this section shall not  
33 prohibit or bar any prosecution or proceeding under such other provision or the imposition of any  
34 penalties provided for thereby.
