serving as its president from 1993 - 1997; she served as president of the League of Women Voters of

WHEREAS, during her time with the League of Women Voters, Connie Houston spearheaded the
 legislative effort to allow election workers to split shifts during the election day and worked for the
 implementation of the Virginia FAMIS legislation to provide low-cost health insurance for children in
 Virginia; and

WHEREAS, Connie Houston also served as a member of the board of the Fairfax County Water
Authority since 1989 and as board vice chairman since 2005, where she was known for her intelligence
and diplomacy; she served on every committee during her 20-year tenure and worked to build consensus
on a variety of issues; and
