4	Establishing a joint subcommittee to study the expansion and funding of high-speed passenger rail
5	service in the Commonwealth. Report.

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10	WHEREAS, Virginia is in the process of establishing high-speed passenger rail service between Bishmond and Washington and hetware Bishmond and Hampton Boaday and
11 12	Richmond and Washington and between Richmond and Hampton Roads; and
12	WHEREAS, high-speed passenger rail service provides an alternative to the use of highways for travelers, especially inter-city business travelers; and
13 14	WHEREAS, by decreasing use of highways, increased use of high-speed passenger rail service can
15	reduce highway congestion and improve air quality; and
16	WHEREAS, increased use of high-speed passenger rail service can also stimulate the economy by
17	creating new jobs; now, therefore, be it
18	REŠOLVĚD by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That a joint subcommittee be
19	established to study the expansion and funding of high-speed passenger rail service in the
20	Commonwealth. The joint subcommittee shall consist of 10 members appointed as follows: four
21	members of the Senate to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules, and six members of the
22	House of Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates, in accordance with the
23 24	principles of proportional representation contained in the Rules of the House of Delegates. The joint subcommittee shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman from among its membership.
24 25	In conducting its study, the joint subcommittee shall assess the desirability and possibility of
2 5 2 6	expanding high-speed passenger rail service connecting the larger metropolitan areas of the
27	Commonwealth. The joint subcommittee shall consider which metropolitan areas might benefit most
28	from such service, the relative priority of competing rail corridors where such service might be provided,
29	and the most efficient and beneficial method by which such service should be funded.
30	Administrative staff support shall be provided by the Office of the Clerk of the Senate. Legal,
31	research, policy analysis, and other services as requested by the joint subcommittee shall be provided by
32	the Division of Legislative Services. Technical assistance shall be provided by the Virginia Department
33	of Rail and Public Transportation and the Office of the Virginia Secretary of Transportation. All
34 35	agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the joint subcommittee for this study, upon request.
33 36	The joint subcommittee shall be limited to four meetings for the 2010 interim, and the direct costs of
37	this study shall not exceed \$ 10,000 without approval as set out in this resolution. Approval for
38	unbudgeted nonmember-related expenses shall require the written authorization of the chairman of the
39	joint subcommittee and the respective Clerk. If a companion joint resolution of the other chamber is
40	agreed to, written authorization of both Clerks shall be required.
41	No recommendation of the joint subcommittee shall be adopted if a majority of the Senate members
42	or a majority of the House members appointed to the joint subcommittee (i) vote against the
43	recommendation, and (ii) vote for the recommendation to fail notwithstanding the majority vote of the
44 45	joint subcommittee.
45 46	The joint subcommittee shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2010, and the chairman shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and
47	recommendations no later than the first day of the 2011 Regular Session of the General Assembly. The
48	executive summary shall state whether the joint subcommittee intends to submit to the General
49	Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and recommendations for publication as a document.
50	The executive summary and report, if any, shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the
51	Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and
52	shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.
53	Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint
54 55	Rules Committee. The Committee may approve or disapprove expenditures for this study, extend or delay the period for the conduct of the study or authorize additional meetings during the 2010 interim
55	delay the period for the conduct of the study, or authorize additional meetings during the 2010 interim.

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
