10	WHEREAS, childhood obesity is a growing problem across the nation, including here in Virginia;
11	and
12	WHEREAS, since school-age children spend much of their time in school, during which time they
13	sometimes consume two of their three daily meals, school seems an ideal place to address this concern;
14	and
15	WHEREAS, the school system is uniquely situated to teach children the healthy living skills they
16	will need now and for the rest of their lives; and
17	WHEREAS, currently, the Standards of Learning do not specifically address this issue; now,
18	therefore, be it
19	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Department of Education be
20 21	requested to study the feasibility of adding a curriculum and Standard of Learning relating to healthy lifestyle choices and reducing childhood obesity.
<sup>21</sup> 22	In conducting its study, the Department shall (i) examine existing Standards of Learning to see where
$\frac{22}{23}$	such curriculum might fit within the existing framework, (ii) consider the feasibility of adding a new
23 24	curriculum and Standard of Learning to address this need, (iii) consider other ways of implementing this
25	type of curriculum outside of the Standards of Learning, and (iv) consider input from local school
26	divisions on this issue.
27	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Department for this study, upon
28	request.
29	The Department of Education shall complete its meetings for the first year by November 30, 2010,
30	and for the second year by November 30, 2011, and the Department shall submit to the Governor and
31	the General Assembly an executive summary and report of its findings and recommendations for
32	publication as a House or Senate document for each year. The executive summaries and reports shall be
33	submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the
34	processing of legislative documents and reports no later than the first day of the next Regular Session of
35	the General Assembly and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.

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
