4	Proposing an amendment to Section 8 of Article X of the Constitution of Virginia, relating to limit of
5 6	tax or revenue and the Revenue Stabilization Fund.

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10	WHEREAS, a proposed amendment to the Constitution of Virginia, hereinafter set forth, was agreed
11	to by a majority of the members elected to each of the two houses of the General Assembly at the
12	regular session of 2009 and referred to this, the next regular session held after the 2009 general election
13 14	of members of the House of Delegates, as required by the Constitution of Virginia; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the following amendment to the
15	Constitution of Virginia be, and the same hereby is, proposed in conformity with the provisions of
16	Section 1 of Article XII of the Constitution of Virginia, namely:
17	Amend Section 8 of Article X of the Constitution of Virginia as follows:
18	ARTICLE X
19	TAXATION AND FINANCE
20 21	Section 8. Limit of tax or revenue; <i>Revenue Stabilization Fund</i> . No other or greater amount of tax or revenues shall, at any time, be levied than may be required for
21 22	the necessary expenses of the government, or to pay the indebtedness of the Commonwealth.
23	The General Assembly shall establish the Revenue Stabilization Fund. The Fund shall consist of an
24	amount not to exceed ten <i>fifteen</i> percent of the Commonwealth's average annual tax revenues derived
25	from taxes on income and retail sales as certified by the Auditor of Public Accounts for the three fiscal
26	years immediately preceding. The Auditor of Public Accounts shall compute the ten fifteen percent
27	limitation of such fund annually and report to the General Assembly not later than the first day of
28 29	December. "Certified tax revenues" means the Commonwealth's annual tax revenues derived from taxes on income and retail sales as certified by the Auditor of Public Accounts.
3 0	The General Assembly shall make deposits to the Fund to equal at least fifty percent of the product
31	of the certified tax revenues collected in the most recently ended fiscal year times the difference
32	between the annual percentage increase in the certified tax revenues collected for the most recently
33	ended fiscal year and the average annual percentage increase in the certified tax revenues collected in
34	the six fiscal years immediately preceding the most recently ended fiscal year. However, growth in
35 36	certified tax revenues, which is the result of either increases in tax rates on income or retail sales or the repeal of exemptions therefrom, may be excluded, in whole or in part, from the computation
37	immediately preceding for a period of time not to exceed six calendar years from the calendar year in
38	which such tax rate increase or exemption repeal was effective. Additional appropriations may be made
39	at any time so long as the ten <i>fifteen</i> percent limitation established herein is not exceeded. All interest
40	earned on the Fund shall be part thereof; however, if the Fund's balance exceeds the limitation, the
41	amount in excess of the limitation shall be paid into the general fund after appropriation by the General
42 43	Assembly. The General Assembly may appropriate an amount for transfer from the Fund to compensate for no
44	more than one-half of the difference between the total general fund revenues appropriated and a revised
45	general fund revenue forecast presented to the General Assembly prior to or during a subsequent regular
46	or special legislative session. However, no transfer shall be made unless the general fund revenues
47	appropriated exceed such revised general fund revenue forecast by more than two percent of certified tax
48	revenues collected in the most recently ended fiscal year. Furthermore, no appropriation or transfer from
49 50	such fund in any fiscal year shall exceed more than one-half of the balance of the Revenue Stabilization Fund. The General Assembly may enact such laws as may be necessary and appropriate to implement
50 51	the Fund.
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
