4. Title: Assault and battery of a fire marshal

5. Summary:

Under current law, assault and battery is a Class 1 misdemeanor. However, if the offense is committed against any of several specified public safety officials while engaged in the performance of their duties, it is a Class 6 felony, with a mandatory minimum sentence of six months. The proposed legislation would add fire marshals to the list of public safety officials covered under the provision.

8. Fiscal Implications:

For someone convicted of a Class 6 felony, a judge has the option of sentencing him to up to one year in jail, or 1 to 5 years in prison. Therefore, this proposal could result in an increase in the number of persons sentenced to prison.

Pursuant to §30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the Virginia Criminal Sentencing Commission estimates a fiscal impact of \$14,845 (the highest annual cost over the next six years). The amount is based on the projection that the legislation will result in a need for less than one additional prison bed.
