**4. Title:** Appomattox State Scenic River.

**5. Summary:** This bill increases the length of the portion of the Appomattox River that has been designated as a scenic river from 6.2 to 19.2 miles.

**6. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Final.

**7. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** Studies related to this designation have already been completed by the Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR), which is tasked with oversight of these designations. The agency anticipates being able to absorb any additional costs resulting from this bill.

**9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected:** The Department of Conservation and Recreation.

**10. Technical Amendment Necessary:** No.

**11. Other Comments:** Other bills that seek to designate portions of rivers as being components of the Virginia Scenic Rivers System, are the introduced versions of HB136, HB890, SB17 and SB94 (Blackwater River). HB501 (Jordan River), HB503 (Hughes River), and HB1180 (Russell Fork River).
