3. Committee: Passed Both Houses

4. Title: Constitutional amendment; property tax exemptions for certain veterans.

5. Summary: Constitutional amendment (voter referendum); property tax exemptions. Provides for a referendum at the November 2, 2010, election to approve or reject an amendment requiring the General Assembly to provide a real property tax exemption for the principal residence of a veteran, or his or her surviving spouse, if the veteran has a 100 percent service-connected, permanent, and total disability.

7. Budget Amendment Necessary: No, the conferees included the appropriation in enrolled HB 30. SB 31 is identical to this bill.

8. Fiscal Implications: Placing a single proposed amendment on the ballot would have a fiscal impact of \$308,000 on the State Board of Elections, which is a calculated estimate to pay for the newspaper advertisements, posters and brochures required by Code of Virginia, § 30-19.9. Print advertisements in major newspapers impact the expense most. Each additional proposed amendment would have a fiscal impact of \$66,000

11. Other Comments: This bill is identical to SB 31
