**4. Title:**        **Involuntary commitment, certification, and mandatory outpatient treatment orders; appeals.**

**5. Summary:** Reduces from 30 to 10 days the length of time for a person to appeal to circuit court an order for involuntarily commitment, mandatory outpatient treatment, or certification for admission to a training center. The bill also provides that an appeal does not suspend any such order unless so ordered by a judge or special justice. The bill further provides that an order of the circuit court shall not extend the duration of involuntary admission or mandatory outpatient treatment set forth in the order appealed from. The bill also clarifies the role of the attorney for the Commonwealth in the appeal of such an order.
