- **4. Title:** Funeral services; provider to embalm or refrigerate human remains within 24 hours of receipt
- 5. Summary: The enrolled bill requires a funeral services provider to either embalm or refrigerate human remains if it is to be stored more than 48 hours prior to disposition. In addition, a dead human body must be maintained in refrigeration and not be embalmed in the absence of express permission by a next of kin of the deceased or a court order. The bill also provides that a person designated in a signed and notarized writing will take priority over next of kin in making funeral arrangements, and clarifies procedures where the deceased has designated a person to make arrangements for his funeral and disposition of his remains on a U.S. Department of Defense Record of Emergency Data.
