4. Title: **Impeding hunting.**

5. Summary: This bill states that it is a Class 3 misdemeanor for any person to knowingly and intentionally encourage or enable a violation of the baiting law by putting out bait or salt in a place used or occupied by hunters.

6. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Final. No fiscal impact.

7. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

8. Fiscal Implications: None.

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: Department of Game and Inland Fisheries.

10. Technical Amendment Necessary: No.

11. Other Comments: Violation of this provision would be a Class 3 misdemeanor. Anyone convicted of a Class 3 misdemeanor is subject to a fine of up to \$500. There is not enough information available to reliably project the amount of revenue that would be collected from fines as a result of this proposal. Any revenue from fines must be deposited into the Literary Fund.
