4. Title: Availability of basic health insurance.

5. Summary: Availability of basic health insurance. Revises the definition of “health insurer” in § 38.2-3406.1 to include health maintenance organizations (HMOs). Allows HMOs to provide health care plans that do not include all of the mandated benefits. Adds “evidence of coverage” to the policy forms and subscription contracts that must disclose that all state-mandated benefits are not included in the coverage. The disclosure must be included in any application or enrollment form as well as the contract and evidence of coverage. Coverage for mammograms, pap smears, PSA testing, and colorectal cancer screening must be included.
