- 4. Title: Decibel level of sound; authorizes a law-enforcement officer to use certain equipment to determine.

5. Summary/Purpose: Authorizes a law-enforcement officer to use certain equipment to determine the decibel level of sound, including noise. The results of such determinations shall be accepted as prima facie evidence of the decibel level of the sound in any court or legal proceeding where the decibel level of the sound is at issue. The bill also provides that in any court or legal proceeding in which any question arises about the calibration or accuracy of such equipment used to determine the decibel level of sound, a certificate, or a true copy thereof, showing the calibration or testing for accuracy of the equipment, and when and by whom the calibration or test was made, shall be admissible as evidence of the facts therein stated.

- 8. Fiscal implications: The legislation establishes a new program within the Department of General Services (DGS) to perform research on the types of instruments needed to measure decibel levels, determine acceptable decibel levels, establish standards, and coordinate with local law enforcement.

DGS indicates the agency can establish the program during FY 2011 and FY 2012 with funding for to a part-time public administration graduate student.

FY 2011 Methodology Tuition and Compensation for one student = \$22,000 Technology support and supplies = \$3,000 FY 2011 Total = \$25,000

FY 2012 Methodology Tuition and Compensation for one student = \$24,000 (Assumes tuition increase) Technology support and supplies = \$3,000 FY 2012 Total = \$27,000

FY 2013 through FY 2016 DGS indicates the program can be administered with existing resources after the first two years of program development and establishment.
