4. Title: Practice of podiatry; definition

5. Summary: The bill provides that a podiatrist shall not be permitted to testify as an expert witness against a doctor of medicine or osteopathic medicine in connection with a medical malpractice civil court proceeding or a medical malpractice review panel in any case where the doctor or osteopath is a defendant in such proceeding. In addition, the practice of podiatry is clarified to include the prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and cure or alleviation of physical conditions, diseases, pain, or infirmities of the human foot and ankle. The bill also contains an emergency enactment clause.
