8.	Fiscal Implications: According to the Department of Juvenile Justice, the proposed legislation could have a fiscal impact on the department since either a new juvenile correctional center would be needed or the Natural Bridge Juvenile Correctional Center would need to be reopened. Natural Bridge was closed October 10, 2009, as a result of budget cuts. The department states that \$3,010,200 is needed each year to reopen Natural Bridge Juvenile Correctional Center.
	There is a "no cost" solution. This "no cost" solution relies on using one of the remaining four unspecialized, long-term facilities (Beaumont, Bon Air, Culpeper or Hanover) to house nonviolent juvenile offenders. If this approach is used, the department believes its capabilities to manage their remaining juvenile population would be severely impacted and could result in aggressive juveniles being placed with nonaggressive juveniles, or younger residents with older residents.
