4. Title: **Concealed handgun permit applications; right to ore tenus hearing.**

5. Summary: Clarifies that a person who is applying for a concealed handgun permit for the first time has the same right to an ore tenus hearing if the permit is denied as a person who has previously held a concealed handgun permit.

8. Fiscal Implications: This legislation provides for ore tenus hearings if a handgun permit applicant is denied. Ore tenus refers to verbal or oral statements and the practice of a presumption of correctness the appeals court gives to the findings of fact reached by a trial court in a nonjury case.

According to the Supreme Court of Virginia (SCV), this legislation is not expected to have a material fiscal impact on the financial resources of the court system.
