4. Title: Outer Continental Shelf; air pollution control regulations.

- 5. Summary: This bill requires the State Air Pollution Control Board, by January 1, 2011, to adopt any regulations necessary to implement and enforce the requirements of § 328 of the Clean Air Act relating to requirements to control air pollution from Outer Continental Shelf sources. The regulations shall not differ materially from the regulations promulgated by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency in implementing such provision of the Act. The adoption of the regulations is exempt from the provisions of the Administrative Process Act. The measure also directs the Department of Environmental Quality to request the Administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to delegate to the Commonwealth any authority the Administrator has under the Clean Air Act to implement and enforce § 328 of the Clean Air Act.

- **8. Fiscal Implications:** The Department of Environmental Quality will absorb any minimal costs associated with this bill.

11. Other Comments: The second enactment clause states that the Department of Environmental Quality shall request the Administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to delegate to the Commonwealth any authority the Administrator has under the Clean Air Act to implement and enforce the requirements of § 328 of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. § 7627).

The third enactment clause states that the Air Pollution Control Board shall adopt regulations to implement the provisions of this act to be effective within 280 days of its enactment.

The fourth enactment clause states that an emergency exists and this act is in force from its passage.
