Summary: The proposed legislation would allow vehicles driven by active-duty military personnel in uniform to use high-occupancy vehicle (HOV) lanes in Hampton Roads without meeting the requisite number of passengers.  The provision only applies to HOV lanes in the Hampton Roads Planning District, which are located on Interstate 264 in Virginia Beach and Norfolk and Interstate 64 in Norfolk, Chesapeake, Hampton and Newport News. The bill would not become effective until approved by the Federal Highway Administration.

8.	<b>Fiscal Implications:</b> The proposed legislation would allow active-duty military personnel in uniform to utilize HOV lanes without meeting the occupancy requirement.
