- 5. Summary: The proposed legislation would provide the State Fire Marshal the authority to establish a certification program for pyrotechnicians or fireworks operator to design, setup, conduct, or supervise the design, setup, or conducting of any fireworks display, either inside a building or outdoors. The cost to a fireworks operator to become certified would be \$117, with \$37 remitted to the Virginia State Police for the costs of a background check. Each certification would be valid for three years.
