11104658D **HOUSE BILL NO. 1422** 1 2 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 3 (Proposed by the House Committee for Courts of Justice 4 on January 31, 2011) 5 6 (Patrons Prior to Substitute—Delegates Albo, Abbott [HB 2428], Cole [HB 1471] and Ware, O. [HB 1494]) A BILL to amend and reenact  $\frac{1}{8}$  34-26 of the Code of Virginia, relating to homestead exemptions; 7 debtor's exemptions. 8 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 9 1. That § 34-26 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 § 34-26. Poor debtor's exemption; exempt articles enumerated. 11 In addition to the exemptions provided in Chapter 2 (§ 34-4 et seq.) of this title, every householder shall be entitled to hold exempt from creditor process the following enumerated items: 12 1. The family Bible. 13 14 1a. Wedding and engagement rings. 15 2. Family portraits and family heirlooms not to exceed \$5,000 in value. 16 3. (i) A lot in a burial ground, and (ii) any preneed funeral contract not to exceed \$5,000. 17 4. All wearing apparel of the householder not to exceed \$1,000 in value. 4a. All household furnishings including, but not limited to, beds, dressers, floor coverings, stoves, 18 19 refrigerators, washing machines, dryers, sewing machines, pots and pans for cooking, plates, and eating 20 utensils, not to exceed \$5,000 in value. 21 4b. One family firearm, not to exceed \$3,000 in value. 22 5. All animals owned as pets, such as cats, dogs, birds, squirrels, rabbits and other pets not kept or 23 raised for sale or profit. 24 6. Medically prescribed health aids. 25 7. Tools, books, instruments, implements, equipment, and machines, including motor vehicles, vessels, and aircraft, which are necessary for use in the course of the householder's occupation or trade 26 27 not exceeding \$10,000 in value, except that a perfected security interest on such personal property shall 28 have priority over the claim of exemption under this section. A motor vehicle, vessel or aircraft used to 29 commute to and from a place of occupation or trade and not otherwise necessary for use in the course 30 of such occupation or trade shall not be exempt under this subdivision. "Occupation," as used in this subdivision, includes enrollment in any public or private elementary, secondary, or career and technical 31 32 education school or institution of higher education. 33 8. A motor vehicle, not held as exempt under subdivision 7, owned by the householder, not to 34 exceed  $\frac{22,000}{6}$  \$6,000 in value, except that a perfected security interest on the motor vehicle shall have 35 priority over the claim of exemption under this subdivision. 36 The value of an item claimed as exempt under this section shall be the fair market value of the item 37 less any prior security interest. 38 The monetary limits, where provided, are applicable to the total value of property claimed as exempt 39 under that subdivision. 40 The purchase of an item claimed as exempt under this section with nonexempt property in 41 contemplation of bankruptcy or creditor process shall not be deemed to be in fraud of creditors. 42 No officer or other person shall levy or distrain upon, or attach, such articles, or otherwise seek to 43 subject such articles to any lien or process. It shall not be required that a householder designate any property exempt under this section in a deed in order to secure such exemption. 44

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
