10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That §§ 30-232 and 30-236 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 30-232. (Expires July 1, 2012; For contingent expiration - See notes) Virginia Disability
13	Commission; purpose.
14	The Virginia Disability Commission (the Commission) is established in the legislative branch of state
15	government. The purpose of the Commission is to identify and recommend legislative priorities and
16	policies for adoption or examination by the General Assembly in order to provide ongoing support in
17	developing and reviewing services and funding related to Virginians with physical and sensory
18	disabilities. The Commission shall submit its recommendations to the General Assembly and the
19	Governor by October 1 of each year.
20	§ 30-236. (Expires July 1, 2012; For contingent expiration - See notes) Powers and duties of the
21	Commission.
22	The Commission shall have the following powers and duties:
23 24	1. Serve as the primary forum in the Commonwealth where the needs of and issues of affecting people with physical and sensory disabilities are <i>identified and</i> addressed through the collaboration of
24 25	members of the legislative and executive branches of state government, <i>including the staff of legislative</i>
23 26	and executive branch agencies, and citizens of the Commonwealth;
27 27	2. Evaluate Develop, evaluate, and advance budget proposals and legislative and policy issues
28	oriented towards recommendations to support a service system that maximizes the self-sufficiency of
29	Virginians with disabilities;
30	3. Develop and review evaluate recommendations for service program changes and funding related to
31	services for persons with physical and sensory disabilities; and
32	4. Advise on local, state and federal policies and programs relevant to citizens with disabilities; and
33	5. Serve as the primary body for coordinating proposals and recommendations of all commissions
34	and agencies for legislation or budget actions affecting persons with physical and sensory disabilities,
35	including receiving, reviewing, and responding to proposals and recommendations.

4. Advise on local, state and federal policies and programs relevant to citizens with disabilities; and 5. Serve as the primary body for coordinating proposals and recommendations of all commissions and agencies for legislation or budget actions affecting persons with physical and sensory disabilities, including receiving, reviewing, and responding to proposals and recommendations.

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
