- 120 The Virginia Department of Transportation shall erect one identifying sign in the Department's

right-of-way at each site at the request of the Department of Historic Resources to designate The 122 Virginia War of 1812 Heritage Trail. Directional signage for travelers to the site may be erected at the 123 request of the governing body of a local government, or historical organization or foundation with 124 custodial responsibilities for the site. Directional signage shall be placed at the nearest intersection to 125 each site in the Department's right-of-way if there is no conflict with other Department signage. All 126 directional signage shall consist of a common sign design developed by a committee consisting of the 127 Director of the Department of Historic Resources or her designee and one representative of each 128 historical organization, foundation, or local governing body in proximity to the site of the sign. Sign 129 panels and posts shall meet Virginia Department of Transportation specifications. All costs associated 130 with manufacturing, erection, and maintenance of directional signs under this section shall be borne by 131 the requesting party. Signs erected by the Virginia Department of Transportation under this section shall be developed in accordance with applicable provisions of § 10.1-2209 of the Code of Virginia and 132 placed in accordance with all applicable Virginia Department of Transportation regulations. 133
