That §§ 46.2-916.2 and 46.2-916.3 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as 12 13 follows: 14 § 46.2-916.2. Designation of public highways for golf cart and utility vehicle operations. 15 A. No portion of the public highways may be designated for use by golf carts and utility vehicles 16 unless the governing body of the county, city, or town in which that portion of the highway is located has reviewed and approved such highway usage. 17 B. The governing body of any county, city or town may by ordinance authorize the operation of golf 18 19 carts and utility vehicles on designated public highways within its boundaries after (i) considering the 20 speed, volume, and character of motor vehicle traffic using such highways, and (ii) determining that golf cart and utility vehicle operation on particular highways is compatible with state and local transportation 21 22 plans and consistent with the Commonwealth's Statewide Pedestrian Policy provided for in 23 § 33.1-23.03:001. C. Notwithstanding the other provisions of this section, no town that has not established its own 24 25 police department, as defined in § 9.1-165, may authorize the operation of golf carts or utility vehicles. The provision of this subsection shall not apply to the Towns of Claremont, Irvington, or Saxis. 26 27 D. No public highway shall be designated for use by golf carts and utility vehicles if such golf cart 28 and utility vehicle operations will impede the safe and efficient flow of motor vehicle traffic. 29 E. The county, city or town that has authorized the operation of golf carts or utility vehicles shall be 30 responsible for the installation and continuing maintenance of any signs pertaining to the operation of golf carts or utility vehicles. Such county, city or town may include in its ordinance for designating 31 highways the ability to recover its costs of the signs and maintenance pertaining thereto from 32 33 organizations, individuals or entities requesting the designations. The cost of installation and continuing 34 maintenance of any signs pertaining to the operation of golf carts or utility vehicles shall not be paid by 35 the Virginia Department of Transportation. F. Notwithstanding the other provisions of this section, employees of the Department of Conservation 36 37 and Recreation may operate golf carts and utility vehicles on those portions of public highways located 38 within Department of Conservation and Recreation property and on Virginia Department of Transportation-maintained highways that are adjacent to Department of Conservation and Recreation 39 40 property, provided the golf cart or utility vehicle is being operated on highways with speed limits of no 41 more than 35 miles per hour. § 46.2-916.3. Limitations on golf cart and utility vehicle operations on designated public highways. 42 A. Golf cart and utility vehicle operations on designated public highways shall be in accordance with 43 44 the following limitations: 1. A golf cart or utility vehicle may be operated only on designated public highways where the 45 46 posted speed limit is 25 miles per hour or less. A golf cart or utility vehicle may cross a highway at an intersection controlled by a traffic light and in the Town of Colonial Beach at an intersection 47 conspicuously marked as a golf cart crossing by signs posted by the Virginia Department of 48 49 Transportation if the highway has a posted speed limit of no more than 35 miles per hour; 2. In towns with a population of 2,000 or less, a golf cart or utility vehicle may cross a highway at 50 51 an intersection conspicuously marked as a golf cart crossing by signs posted by the Virginia Department 52 of Transportation if the highway has a posted speed limit of no more than 35 miles per hour and the 53 crossing is required as the only means to provide golf cart access from one part of the town to another 54 part of the town; 55 3. No person shall operate any golf cart or utility vehicle on any public highway unless he has in his possession a valid driver's license; 56 4. Every golf cart or utility vehicle, whenever operated on a public highway, shall display a 57

slow-moving vehicle emblem in conformity with § 46.2-1081; and

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5. Golf carts and utility vehicles shall be operated upon the public highways only between sunrise
and sunset, unless equipped with such lights as are required in Article 3 (§ 46.2-1010 et seq.) of Chapter
10 of this title, for different classes of vehicles.

62 B. The limitations of subdivision A 1 shall not apply to golf carts and utility vehicles being operated 63 as follows:

1. To cross a highway from one portion of a golf course to another portion thereof or to another adjacent golf course; or to travel between a person's home and golf course if (i) the trip would not be longer than one-half mile in either direction, and (ii) the speed limit on the road is no more than 35 miles per hour;

68 2. To the extent necessary for local government employees, operating only upon highways located
69 within the locality, to fulfill a governmental purpose, provided the golf cart or utility vehicle is being
70 operated on highways with speed limits of 35 miles per hour or less;

3. As necessary by employees of public or private two-year or four-year institutions of higher
education if operating on highways within the property limits of such institutions, provided the golf cart
or utility vehicle is being operated on highways with speed limits of 35 miles per hour or less; and

4. On a secondary highway system component that has a posted speed limit of no more than 35 miles per hour and is within three miles of a motor speedway with a seating capacity of at least 25,000 but less than 90,000 on the same day as any race or race-related event conducted on that speedway; and

5. To the extent necessary for employees of the Department of Conservation and Recreation,
operating only on highways located within Department of Conservation and Recreation property or
upon Virginia Department of Transportation-maintained highways that are adjacent to Department of
Conservation and Recreation property, to fulfill a governmental purpose, provided that the golf cart or
utility vehicle is being operated on highways with speed limits of no more than 35 miles per hour.

C. The governing body of any county, city, or town may by ordinance impose additional restrictions
or limitations on operations of golf carts, utility vehicles, or both, on public highways within its
boundaries, provided that the restrictions or limitations imposed by any such ordinance are no less
stringent than the restrictions and limitations contained in this article. In the event that any provision of
any such ordinance conflicts with any provision of this section *other than subdivision B 5*, the provision of
of the ordinance shall be controlling.
