Unsolicited proposals to add capacity to the Intermodal Connector of I-664 (Patriot Crossing) to 11 be accepted for review by the Virginia Department of Transportation; procedure. 12 A. The Virginia Department of Transportation is hereby directed to accept for review unsolicited 13 proposals under the Public-Private Transportation Act of 1995 (§ 56-556 et seq. of the Code of 14 15 Virginia) to add physical capacity to the Intermodal Connector of I-664 (Patriot Crossing). Unsolicited 16 proposals shall be filed with the Department no later than September 30, 2011. B. Upon enactment of this act, the Department shall make available on its website the following: (i) 17 all information about the existing Intermodal Connector of I-664 (Patriot Crossing), including traffic 18 counts, maintenance records, and current plans and specifications, and (ii) all information, studies, and 19 20 reports analyzing potential scenarios for the physical expansion of the Intermodal Connector of I-664 21 (Patriot Crossing). The Department may take necessary measures to protect confidential information or 22 to protect vital state and national security interests that may be contained in the information. 23 C. Unsolicited proposals filed pursuant to this act shall provide information regarding team 24 qualifications and experience, project structure, a schedule for project development, and the proposed 25 cost and outline public benefits of the project. The Department shall develop a process that would 26 permit a private entity that is part of a proposal team to assist with the development of state or 27 federally mandated environmental reviews or permits required to complete the project. Completion of 28 reviews or permits shall not be necessary before a decision by the Department to advance consideration 29 of conceptual proposals. 30 D. Within 30 days of the receipt of unsolicited proposals, the Department shall post a public notice 31 of the unsolicited proposals and provide 120 days for competing proposals. Following an internal analysis to determine the financial and technical merit of the proposals and the proposal teams, the 32 33 Department shall recommend no later than May 1, 2012, to the Commonwealth Transportation Board 34 whether to advance no more than two proposals to an Independent Review Panel. The Panel, which 35 shall be appointed by the Secretary of Transportation, shall afford opportunities for public comment on 36 the proposals and provide additional review and analysis of the remaining proposals. 37 E. No later than September 1, 2012, the Department shall recommend to the Commonwealth 38 Transportation Commissioner whether to execute an interim agreement to continue design, 39 environmental reviews, and preliminary right-of-way acquisitions and to take any other steps necessary 40 to advance the development of the project. Moneys in the Transportation Partnership Opportunity Fund 41 may be made available to carry out the provisions of the interim agreement. The interim agreement shall also provide a schedule for the completion of the necessary reviews and approvals for construction 42 43 of the project. 44 2. That the Virginia Department of Transportation shall promptly inform the Joint Commission on Transportation Accountability, as authorized by Chapter 43 (§ 30-282 et seq.) of Title 30 of the 45 46 Code of Virginia, by written update, of its completion of each requirement of this act.
