4 5	<i>Establishing a joint subcommittee to study the fiscal impact of changing family life education from an opt-out program to an opt-in program. Report.</i>

9 10	WHEREAS, the Commonwealth of Virginia currently faces a budget crisis unlike any in recent
11	history; and
12	WHEREAS, the Commonwealth must review every possible way to save the taxpayers and state
13	government money to reduce the current budget deficit; and
14	WHEREAS, public schools in the Commonwealth are facing serious fiscal impact due to the deficit;
15 16	and WHEREAS, public schools in the Commonwealth must be able to focus on the core disciplines; and
17	WHEREAS, family life education is not a core discipline; and
18	WHEREAS, family life education is currently a program that requires parents to opt their children
19	out; now, therefore, be it
20	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That a joint subcommittee be
21 22	established to study the fiscal impact of changing family life education from an opt-out program to an opt-in program. The joint subcommittee shall have a total membership of 15 members that shall consist
$\frac{12}{23}$	of 12 legislative members, two nonlegislative citizen members, and one ex officio member. Members
24	shall be appointed as follows: seven members of the House of Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker
25	of the House of Delegates in accordance with the principles of proportional representation contained in
26	the Rules of the House of Delegates; five members of the Senate to be appointed by the Senate
27 28	Committee on Rules; one nonlegislative citizen member who is a representative of an accredited private school to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates; and one nonlegislative citizen member
20 29	who is a parent of a school-age child to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules. The Secretary
30	of Education or his designee shall serve ex officio with voting privileges. Nonlegislative citizen
31	members of the joint subcommittee shall be citizens of the Commonwealth of Virginia. Unless otherwise
32	approved in writing by the chairman of the joint subcommittee and the respective Clerk, nonlegislative
33 34	citizen members shall only be reimbursed for travel originating and ending within the Commonwealth of Virginia for the purpose of attending meetings. If a companion joint resolution of the other chamber is
35	agreed to, written authorization of both Clerks shall be required. The joint subcommittee shall elect a
36	chairman and vice-chairman from among its membership, who shall be members of the General
37	Assembly.
38	In conducting its study, the joint subcommittee shall (i) determine the cost of family life education to
39 40	each public school division in the Commonwealth, (ii) estimate how many students would choose to participate in family life education should the program be changed to opt-in, and (iii) determine how
41	much money the Commonwealth and each school division would save by changing family life education
42	to an opt-in program.
43	Administrative staff support shall be provided by the Office of the Clerk of the House of Delegates.
44 45	Legal, research, policy analysis, and other services as requested by the joint subcommittee shall be provided by the Division of Legislative Services. Technical assistance shall be provided by the
43 46	Department of Education. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the joint
47	subcommittee for this study, upon request.
48	The joint subcommittee shall be limited to four meetings for the 2011 interim and four meetings for
49	the 2012 interim, and the direct costs of this study shall not exceed \$12,800 for each year without
50 51	approval as set out in this resolution. Approval for unbudgeted nonmember-related expenses shall require the written authorization of the chairman of the ioint subcommittee and the respective Clark. If a
51 52	the written authorization of the chairman of the joint subcommittee and the respective Clerk. If a companion joint resolution of the other chamber is agreed to, written authorization of both Clerks shall
53	be required.
54	No recommendation of the joint subcommittee shall be adopted if a majority of the House members
55	or a majority of the Senate members appointed to the joint subcommittee (i) vote against the
56 57	recommendation and (ii) vote for the recommendation to fail notwithstanding the majority vote of the joint subcommittee.
57 58	The joint subcommittee shall complete its meetings for the first year by November 30, 2011, and for
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the second year by November 30, 2012, and the chairman shall submit to the Division of Legislative 59 Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and recommendations no later than the first 60 61 day of the next Regular Session of the General Assembly for each year. Each executive summary shall 62 state whether the joint subcommittee intends to submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a 63 report of its findings and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The 64 executive summaries and reports shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be 65 posted on the General Assembly's website. 66

67 Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint68 Rules Committee. The Committee may approve or disapprove expenditures for this study, extend or69 delay the period for the conduct of the study, or authorize additional meetings during the 2011 or 2012

70 interims.
