WHEREAS, the Richmond Academy of Medicine created Access Now Inc. in 2008 in response to the pressing need for specialty care for impoverished and uninsured residents of Virginia's capital region, including 27 localities from Ashland to Petersburg; and

WHEREAS, Access Now is Virginia's single largest network of 900 physician volunteers, representing 42 specialty and sub-specialty fields and the medical professionals who assist them; and

WHEREAS, Access Now has been designated as a Neighborhood Builder by the Bank of America and is generously supported by area foundations and community hospitals that recognize its worthy cause; and

WHEREAS, Access Now's medical professionals are a shining example of civic involvement from the private sector in helping people find hope and good health, helping to enhance the capital region's quality of life and the health of its families and workers; and

WHEREAS, a grateful Commonwealth expresses its sincere gratitude and deep appreciation to Access Now's dedicated volunteers for their many valuable contributions to improving the quality of life and health care in the Commonwealth of Virginia; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby commend Access Now for its many valuable contributions to the quality of life and health for individuals in the Commonwealth; and, be it
