11104105D **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 608** 1 2 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 3 (Proposed by the House Committee on Rules 4 on January 18, 2011) 5 6 (Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate Bell, R.P.) Commemorating Veterans Day on November 11, 2011, in Virginia with a moment of silence. 7 WHEREAS, Veterans Day, originally called Armistice Day, is a federal holiday observed on November 11 annually in the United States to honor all military personnel, living and dead, who served 8 9 the country during times of peace and war, and commemorates the end of World War I; and 10 WHEREAS, Veterans Day was first observed on November 11, 1919, the anniversary of the end of 11 the war in response to a proclamation issued by President Woodrow Wilson that expressed pride in the heroism of those who died during the war; and 12 WHEREAS, World War I, the "Great War," "the war to end all wars," began in August 1914, was 13 14 centered in Europe and involved all of the world's great powers which had assembled in two opposing 15 alliances, the Allies and the Central Powers; and 16 WHEREAS, although alliances, imperialism, militarism, and nationalism were long-term causal 17 factors of the war, the assassination of Archduke Franz Ferdinand of Austria, the heir to the throne of Austria-Hungary, and his wife, on June 28, 1914, triggered the beginning of the war; and 18 WHEREAS, World War I was considered to be the first "modern" war, displaying effects never seen 19 20 before in previous wars, and more than 70 million military personnel, including 60 million Europeans, 21 were mobilized in one of the largest wars in history resulting in more than nine million combatants 22 being killed, primarily because of great technological advances in firepower without corresponding 23 advances in mobility; and 24 WHEREAS, the United States became involved in the war in April 1917, and the World War I 25 Memorial and Centennial Act of 2009 states that "more than 4,000,000 American men and women served in uniform in the defense of liberty, among them two future presidents, Harry S. Truman and 26 27 Dwight D. Eisenhower; two million Americans served overseas during the war, including 200,000 naval 28 personnel; the United States suffered 375,000 casualties; and the events of 1914 through 1918 shaped 29 the world, the United States, and the lives of millions of people in countless ways"; and WHEREAS, the Armistice was signed on November 11, 1918, at 11:00 a.m., "the 11th hour of the 30 11th day of the 11th month," halting the fighting and hostilities between the Allied Nations and 31 32 Germany, and the war ended officially with the signing of the Treaty of Versailles on June 28, 1919; 33 and 34 WHEREAS, during the 1920s and 1930s, many states made Veterans Day a state holiday, and in 35 1938, Congress declared Armistice Day a federal holiday; and 36 WHEREAS, Armistice Day was renamed Veterans Day in 1954 to honor American veterans of 37 World War II and the Korean War, and today veterans of all wars are honored on the holiday; and 38 WHEREAS, it is fitting and proper that the signing of the Armistice, signaling the end of World War I, "the Great War," be commemorated on Veterans Day, November 11, 2011, at 11:00 a.m., throughout 39 40 the Commonwealth with a moment of silence to memorialize this historic event; now, therefore, be it 41 RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That Veterans Day on November 11, 42 2011, in Virginia be commemorated with a moment of silence; and, be it 43 RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Governor be requested to call upon the citizens of the Commonwealth to observe November 11, 2011, at 11:00 a.m. with a moment of silence in respect for 44 and to honor and remember the great sacrifices and contributions of the heroic men and women of the 45 United States Armed Forces who valiantly served this nation and mankind during World War I and 46 47 subsequent wars; and, be it **48** RESOLVED FINALLY, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates transmit a copy of this resolution to the Honorable Robert F. McDonnell, Governor of Virginia, requesting that he lead and encourage the 49 people of the Commonwealth to pause for a moment of silence on November 11, 2011, at 11:00 a.m., 50 and to the Director of the Virginia Department of Veterans Services, the Superintendent of Public 51 Instruction, and the Executive Director of the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia, requesting 52 53 that they further disseminate copies of this resolution to their respective constituents so that they may be 54 apprised of the sense of the General Assembly of Virginia in this matter.
