10	WHEREAS, Langerhans cell histiocytosis, hemophagocytic lymphohistiocytosis, xanthogranuloma,
11	Erdheim Chester disease, Rosai Dorfman disease, and pulmonary eosinophilic granuloma are a group of
12	rare diseases that affect both children and adults; and
13	WHEREAS, these diseases are considered "orphan diseases," meaning they affect fewer than 200,000
14	people per year in the United States; and
15	WHEREAS, these diseases occur because of the overproduction of a certain cell in the body and
16 17	wherever these cells accumulate, they cause "cancer-like" damage; and WHEREAS, although these diseases are not a cancer, the pain and suffering of patients can be just
18	as severe as that caused by the more prevalent diseases that receive a high priority for federal research
19	funding; and
20	WHEREAS, patients with these diseases can suffer damage to their central nervous system, brain,
21	skin, bones, liver, lungs, and spleen; and
22	WHEREAS, some patients can experience a single lesion that goes into remission while others may
23	have several sites of involvement that can be chronic and debilitating; patients with extensive damage to
24 25	their body may not survive; and WHEREAS, patients with this disease may be treated with chemotherapy, surgery, and/or radiation;
23 26	however, there is no known cure and the goal of treatment is to cause the disease to go into remission;

28	WHEREAS, increased funding to the National Institutes of Health is crucial to enable research into
29	these diseases; and
30	WHEREAS, the Histiocytosis Association of America is the only nonprofit organization in the world
31	that is working to raise awareness and provide educational and emotional support to patients and
32 33	families while also funding peer-reviewed research to lead to better treatments and a cure; and WHEREAS, through the hard work of families and friends, the Histiocytosis Association of America
33 34	has been able to facilitate the funding of 135 peer-reviewed research grants seeking better treatments and
35	a cure; and
36	WHEREAS, research into these disorders not only offers hope to the many patients and their families
37	but also offers the possibility of learning more about other prevalent diseases in the process; and
38	WHEREAS, designating September as "Histiocytosis Awareness Month" in Virginia will encourage
	health care providers to learn more about these diseases; encourage the National Institutes of Health and
40 41	related institutes to expand their rare disease initiative; and support increased research for all histiocytic disorders; and
42	WHEREAS, the designation will also give special recognition to the families and friends who have
43	worked tirelessly to help the Histiocytosis Association of America raise awareness of these diseases and
44	provide educational and support programs while also funding peer-reviewed research leading to better
45	treatments and a cure; now, therefore, be it

47	September, in 2011 and in each succeeding year, as Histiocytosis Awareness Month in Virginia; and, be
