WHEREAS, the James Madison High School girls' basketball team dedicated their January 14, 2011, victory against Langley High School to Khristin Kyllo; and

WHEREAS, hundreds of friends, neighbors, and high school classmates, teammates, teachers, and coaches gathered at the James Madison High School rock for a candlelit vigil on January 15, 2011, to celebrate the vibrant life of Khristin Kyllo with stories of her sense of humor and passion for life; and

WHEREAS, Khristin Kyllo will be fondly remembered by her parents, Tom and Julie; her brother, Tommy; her grandmother, Carol; and all whose days she brightened with her enthusiasm and her smile; now, therefore, be it
