WHEREAS, throughout his career, Kenneth Fitzgerald furthered his education, receiving an associate's degree and completing studies at the Northwestern University Traffic Institute, National Intelligence Academy, Southern Police Institute, and Sorensen Institute for Political Leadership; and

WHEREAS, a knowledgeable role model, Kenneth Fitzgerald has generously shared his experience and expertise with new recruits as they embark upon their law-enforcement careers and guided more experienced officers as they have advanced; and

WHEREAS, Kenneth Fitzgerald has received numerous awards and accolades for his outstanding service, including recognition as the 1980 Danville Jaycees Outstanding Law Enforcement Officer of the Year, a 1995 Certificate of Merit from the Recording Industry Association of America, and 1996 Commission as a Kentucky Colonel by Governor Paul Patton of Kentucky among others; and

WHEREAS, Major Fitzgerald has protected and served the citizens of Danville with great honor, integrity, and commitment to excellence in keeping with the proud traditions of the Danville Police Department; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly commend an exemplary law-enforcement professional, Major Kenneth D. Fitzgerald, on the occasion of his retirement; and, be it
