WHEREAS, a man of great faith, Al Saunders was a lifelong member of Oakland Christian Church, where he served his fellow members and the community as a deacon, member of several building committees, former superintendent of the Sunday school, and participant in the church's many missions;

WHEREAS, Al Saunders was recognized for his generous civic spirit and numerous contributions to Suffolk with his selection, along with his wife, Georgia, as a First Citizen of Suffolk; and

WHEREAS, predeceased by his wife, Georgia, Al Saunders will be fondly remembered and greatly missed by his children, Mary, Ann, Paul, Douglas, and Kathy and their families; and numerous other family members and friends; now, therefore, be it
