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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 54.1-3420.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 54.1-3420.1. Identification required for filling prescriptions.
13 14	A. Before dispensing any drug listed on Schedules III through V, a pharmacist may require proof of identity from any patient presenting a preservation or requesting a regill of a preservation
14 15	identity from any patient presenting a prescription or requesting a refill of a prescription. B. A pharmacist, <i>or his agent</i> , shall require proof of identity <i>at the time of delivery</i> from any person
15 16	seeking to take delivery of any drug listed on Schedule II pursuant to a valid prescription before
17	dispensing such drug, unless such person is known to the pharmacist or to his agent. If the person
18	seeking to take delivery of a drug listed on Schedule II pursuant to a valid prescription is not the patient
19	for whom the drug is prescribed, the pharmacist shall may record the full name and address of such
20	person, regardless of whether the person seeking to take delivery of the drug is known to the
2 ľ	pharmacist. When proof of identity is required from a person seeking to take delivery of a drug pursuant
22	to this subsection, the pharmacist shall may make a photocopy or electronic copy of his proof of
23	identity, or an electronic record documenting that proof of identity was provided. The pharmacist shall
24	may keep records of the names and addresses and copies of proof of identity of persons taking delivery
25	of drugs as required by this subsection for a period of at least one year. For the purposes of this
26	subsection, "proof of identity" means a driver's license, government-issued identification card, or other
27	photo identification along with documentation of the person's current address.
28	C. Whenever any pharmacist permitted to operate in the Commonwealth or nonresident pharmacist

28 C. Whenever any pharmacist permitted to operate in the Commonwealth or nonresident pharmacist
29 registered to conduct business in the Commonwealth delivers a prescription drug order for any drug
30 listed on Schedule II by mail, common carrier, or delivery service to a Virginia address, the method of
31 delivery employed shall require the signature of the recipient as confirmation of receipt.
