11104730D **SENATE BILL NO. 1425** 1 2 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 3 (Proposed by the Senate Committee on General Laws and Technology 4 on January 26, 2011) 5 6 (Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Locke) A BILL to amend and reenact § 2.2-4330 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the Virginia Public 7 Procurement Act; process for withdrawal of bid due to error. 8 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 9 1. That § 2.2-4330 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: § 2.2-4330. Withdrawal of bid due to error. 10 A. A bidder for a public construction contract, other than a contract for construction or maintenance 11 of public highways, may withdraw his bid from consideration if the price bid was substantially lower 12 than the other bids due solely to a mistake in the bid, provided the bid was submitted in good faith, and 13 the mistake was a clerical mistake as opposed to a judgment mistake, and was actually due to an 14 15 unintentional arithmetic error or an unintentional omission of a quantity of work, labor or material made 16 directly in the compilation of a bid, which unintentional arithmetic error or unintentional omission can 17 be clearly shown by objective evidence drawn from inspection of original work papers, documents and materials used in the preparation of the bid sought to be withdrawn. 18 If a bid contains both clerical and judgment mistakes, a bidder may withdraw his bid from 19 20 consideration if the price bid would have been substantially lower than the other bids due solely to the 21 clerical mistake, that was an unintentional arithmetic error or an unintentional omission of a quantity of work, labor or material made directly in the compilation of a bid that shall be clearly shown by 22 23 objective evidence drawn from inspection of original work papers, documents and materials used in the 24 preparation of the bid sought to be withdrawn. B. One of the following procedures for withdrawal of a bid shall be selected by the public body and 25 26 stated in the advertisement for bids: 27 (i) the *l*. The bidder shall give notice in writing of his claim of right to withdraw his bid within two 28 business days after the conclusion of the bid opening procedure and shall submit original work papers 29 with such notice: or 30 (ii)2. Where the public body opens the bids one day following the time fixed for the submission of 31 bids, the bidder shall submit to the public body or designated official his original work papers, documents and materials used in the preparation of the bid within one day after the date fixed for 32 submission of bids at or prior to the time fixed for the opening of bids. The work papers shall be 33 34 delivered by the bidder in person or by registered mail. at or prior to the time fixed for the opening of 35 bids. In either instance, the work papers, documents and materials may be considered as trade secrets or 36 proprietary information subject to the conditions of subsection F of § 2.2-4342. The bids shall be opened 37 one day following the time fixed by the public body for the submission of bids. Thereafter, the The 38 bidder shall have two hours after the opening of bids within which to claim in writing any mistake as 39 defined herein and withdraw his bid. The contract shall not be awarded by the public body until the 40 two-hour period has elapsed. 41 The Under these procedures, the mistake shall be proved only from the original work papers, 42 documents and materials delivered as required herein. The work papers, documents and materials 43 submitted by the bidder shall, at the bidder's request, be considered trade secrets or proprietary information subject to the conditions of subsection F of § 2.2-4342. 44 BC. A public body may establish procedures for the withdrawal of bids for other than construction 45 46 contracts. 47 CD. No bid shall be withdrawn under this section when the result would be the awarding of the **48** contract on another bid of the same bidder or of another bidder in which the ownership of the 49 withdrawing bidder is more than five percent. 50 DE. If a bid is withdrawn in accordance with this section, the lowest remaining bid shall be deemed 51 to be the low bid. EF. No bidder who is permitted to withdraw a bid shall, for compensation, supply any material or 52 53 labor to or perform any subcontract or other work agreement for the person or firm to whom the 54 contract is awarded or otherwise benefit, directly or indirectly, from the performance of the project for 55 which the withdrawn bid was submitted. F. G. The public body shall notify the bidder in writing within five business days of its decision 56

regarding the bidder's request to withdraw its bid. If the public body denies the withdrawal of a bid
under the provisions of this section, it shall notify the bidder in writing stating state in such notice the
reasons for its decision and award the contract to such bidder at the bid price, provided such bidder is a

- responsible and responsive bidder. At the same time that the notice is provided, the public body shall return all work papers and copies thereof that have been submitted by the bidder. 60
