11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That § 54.1-2301 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
13	§ 54.1-2301. Board for Waterworks and Wastewater Works Operators and Onsite Sewage System
14	Professionals; membership; terms; duties.
15	A. The Board for Waterworks and Wastewater Works Operators and Onsite Sewage System
16	Professionals shall consist of 11 members as follows: the Director of the Office of Water Programs of
17	the State Department of Health, or his designee, the Executive Director of the State Water Control
18	Board, or his designee, a currently employed waterworks operator having a valid license of the highest
19	classification issued by the Board, a currently employed wastewater works operator having a valid
20	license of the highest classification issued by the Board, a faculty member of a state university or
21	college whose principal field of teaching is management or operation of waterworks or wastewater
22	works, a representative of an owner of a waterworks, a representative of an owner of a wastewater
23 24	works, a licensed alternative onsite sewage system operator, a licensed alternative onsite sewage system
24 25	installer, a licensed onsite soil evaluator, and one citizen member. The alternative onsite sewage system operator, alternative onsite sewage system installer, and onsite soil evaluator shall have practiced for at
23 26	least five consecutive years immediately prior to appointment. No owner shall be represented on the
2 7	Board by more than one representative or employee operator. The term of Board members shall be four
28	years.
29	B. The Board shall examine waterworks and wastewater works operators and issue licenses. The
30	licenses may be issued in specific operator classifications to attest to the competency of an operator to
31	supervise and operate waterworks and wastewater works while protecting the public health, welfare and
32	property and conserving and protecting the water resources of the Commonwealth.
33	C. The Board shall establish a program for licensing individuals as onsite soil evaluators, onsite
34	sewage system installers, and onsite sewage system operators.
35 36	D. The Board, in consultation with the Board of Health, shall adopt regulations for the licensure of (i) onsite soil evaluators; (ii) installers of alternative onsite sewage systems, as defined in § 32.1-163;
30 37	and (iii) operators of alternative onsite sewage systems, as defined in § 32.1-163. Such regulations shall
38	include requirements for (a) minimum education and training, including approved training courses; (b)
39	relevant work experience; (c) demonstrated knowledge and skill; (d) application fees to cover the costs
40	of the program, renewal fees, and schedules; (e) the division of onsite soil evaluators into classes, one of
41	which shall be restricted to the design of conventional onsite sewage systems; and (f) other criteria the
42	Board deems necessary.
43	Notwithstanding any other provision of this subsection, unless an applicant is found by the Board to
44	have engaged in any act that would constitute grounds for disciplinary action, the Board shall issue a
45	license to install alternative onsite sewage systems, without examination, to any applicant who provides
46	satisfactory proof to the Board of having been actively and continuously providing services as an
47	installer of alternative onsite sewage systems immediately prior to July 1, 2007, for at least two years.
