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12	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
13	1. That § 2.2-2101 of the Code of Virginia, as it is currently effective and as it may become
14	effective, is amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in
15	Chapter 27 of Title 2.2 an article numbered 10, consisting of sections numbered 2.2-2734 through
16	2.2-2737, as follows:
17	§ 2.2-2101. (Effective until July 1, 2013) Prohibition against service by legislators on boards,
18	commissions, and councils within the executive branch; exceptions.
19	Members of the General Assembly shall be ineligible to serve on boards, commissions, and councils
20	within the executive branch of state government who are responsible for administering programs
21	established by the General Assembly. Such prohibition shall not extend to boards, commissions, and
22	councils engaged solely in policy studies or commemorative activities. If any law directs the
23	appointment of any member of the General Assembly to a board, commission, or council in the
24	executive branch of state government that is responsible for administering programs established by the
25	General Assembly, such portion of such law shall be void, and the Governor shall appoint another
26	person from the Commonwealth at large to fill such a position.

	§ 2.2-2101. (Effective July 1, 2013) Prohibition against service by legislators on boards,
33	commissions, and councils within the executive branch; exceptions.

Members of the General Assembly shall be ineligible to serve on boards, commissions, and councils within the executive branch of state government who are responsible for administering programs established by the General Assembly. Such prohibition shall not extend to boards, commissions, and councils engaged solely in policy studies or commemorative activities. If any law directs the appointment of any member of the General Assembly to a board, commission, or council in the **SB893** 

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59 executive branch of state government that is responsible for administering programs established by the 60 General Assembly, such portion of such law shall be void, and the Governor shall appoint another person from the Commonwealth at large to fill such a position. 61

## Article 10.

## Southwest Virginia Cultural Heritage Foundation.

§ 2.2-2734. Southwest Virginia Cultural Heritage Foundation established; purpose.

89 The Southwest Virginia Cultural Heritage Foundation (the Foundation) is hereby established as a 90 body politic and corporate. The purpose of the Foundation is to encourage the economic development of 91 Southwest Virginia through the expansion of cultural and natural heritage ventures and initiatives 92 related to tourism and other asset-based enterprises, including the Heartwood: Southwest Virginia's Artisan Center, The Crooked Road, 'Round the Mountain, and other related cultural and natural 93 94 heritage organizations and venues that promote entrepreneurial and employment opportunities. 95

§ 2.2-2735. Membership; qualifications; terms; vacancies; officers; compensation.

A. The Foundation shall be administered by a board of trustees, consisting of 23 members as 96 97 follows: two members of the Senate to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules; three members 98 of the House of Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates in accordance with 99 the principles of proportional representation contained in the Rules of the House of Delegates; two nonlegislative citizen members who shall be residents of Southwest Virginia and two nonlegislative 100 101 citizen members who shall be executive directors of either Planning District Commission 1, 2, 3, 4, or 102 12 or their designees, to be appointed by the Governor; one nonlegislative citizen member who shall be an elected or appointed official of the Town of Abingdon to be appointed by the Governor upon the 103 recommendation, if any, of the Abingdon Town Council; one nonlegislative citizen member who shall be 104 an elected or appointed official of Washington County to be appointed by the Governor upon the recommendation, if any, of the Washington County Board of Supervisors; four nonlegislative citizen 105 106 107 members who shall be artisans and members of 'Round the Mountain, who shall be appointed by the 108 Governor upon the recommendation of the executive committee of 'Round the Mountain; and one 109 nonlegislative citizen member who shall represent the Ninth Congressional District and serve as a 110 member of the Virginia Commission for the Arts, to be appointed by the Governor upon the 111 recommendation, if any, of the Executive Director of the Virginia Commission for the Arts. The Chancellor of the Virginia Community College System and the President of Virginia Highlands 112 113 Community College or their designees shall serve ex officio with nonvoting privileges. The Chairman of The Crooked Road, the Chairman of 'Round the Mountain, the Director of the Virginia Department of 114 115 Housing and Community Development, the Director of the Virginia Tourism Corporation, and the Executive Director of the Southwest Virginia Higher Education Center or their designees shall serve ex 116 117 officio with voting privileges.

B. Legislative members and ex officio members of the Foundation board of trustees shall serve terms 118 119 coincident with their terms of office. Appointments to fill vacancies, other than by expiration of a term, shall be for the unexpired term. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the original 120

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121 appointments. All members may be reappointed.

122 C. No House member shall serve more than four consecutive two-year terms, no Senate member
123 shall serve more than two consecutive four-year terms, and no nonlegislative citizen member shall serve
124 more than two consecutive four-year terms. The remainder of any term to which a member is appointed
125 to fill a vacancy shall not constitute a term in determining the member's eligibility for reappointment.

D. Legislative members shall receive such compensation as provided in § 30-19.12. All members of
the Foundation shall be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the
performance of their duties as provided in §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825. Funding for the costs of
compensation and expenses of the members shall be provided by the Department of Housing and
Community Development.

E. The Foundation shall elect a chairman and a vice-chairman from among its members and may
 appoint such other officers as it deems necessary. The Foundation shall appoint an executive committee
 and such other committees as it deems necessary to oversee personnel and other areas related to
 operations and the achievement of the goals of the Foundation.

135 § 2.2-2736. Powers and duties of the Foundation.

**136** *A. The Foundation shall have the power and duty to:* 

137 1. Accept, execute, and administer any trust in which it may have an interest under the terms of the138 instrument creating the trust;

**139** 2. Establish and administer agreements with public or private agencies in order to achieve its goals;

140 3. Rent, lease, including the execution of leases with option to purchase, buy, own, acquire, and
141 dispose of such property, real and personal, as the Foundation deems proper to carry out any of the
142 purposes and provisions of this article;

4. Finance, fund, plan, establish, construct, enlarge, extend, equip, update, and maintain buildings,
structures, and facilities that are necessary or desirable to achieve its goals;

145 5. Establish a corporation eligible for exemption from income taxation under § 501(c) of the Internal
 146 Revenue Code to assist in carrying out the purposes of the Foundation;

147 6. Operate, manage, and oversee the retail sales, demonstration, performance, and interpretation of
148 artisan, musical, or other cultural activities, food and visitor services, and other functions as may be
149 necessary or desirable to achieve its goals;

150 7. Employ and compensate such employees and agents as the Foundation deems necessary. The
151 Foundation may appoint an executive director who shall be authorized to employ such staff as necessary
152 to enable the Foundation to achieve its goals. The Foundation shall determine the duties of such staff
153 and fix salaries and compensation from such funds as may be received;

154 8. Borrow and seek, accept, and expend gifts, grants, or donations from public or private sources;

155 9. Manage the operations of any existing or new facility in accordance with the provisions of this 156 article;

157 10. Facilitate the sustainability of economic development initiatives relating to the cultural and
158 natural heritage of Southwest Virginia by providing financial resources and technical assistance to
159 organizations and venues that contribute to achieving the goals of the Foundation;

160 11. Serve as a resource and referral center by maintaining and disseminating information about
 161 Southwest Virginia cultural and natural heritage efforts and venues;

162 12. Develop specific goals and initiatives intended to improve the quality of life and entrepreneurial
163 opportunities in Southwest Virginia in coordination with the Virginia Tourism Corporation, the Virginia
164 Department of Housing and Community Development, Southwest Virginia tourism and economic
165 development organizations, local governments, and other entities; and

166 13. Submit to the Governor and the General Assembly no later than the first day of each regular
167 session of the General Assembly an annual report for publication as a report document in accordance
168 with the procedures established by the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for legislative
169 documents and reports.

170 B. The Foundation may establish nonprofit, nonstock corporations under Chapter 10 (§ 13.1-801 et 171 seq.) of Title 13.1 as public instrumentalities exercising public and essential governmental functions to 172 assist the Foundation in (i) encouraging the economic development of Southwest Virginia through the 173 expansion of cultural and natural heritage ventures and initiatives related to tourism and other 174 asset-based enterprises, including the Southwest Virginia Artisan Center, The Crooked Road, 'Round the 175 Mountain, and related cultural and natural heritage organizations and venues that promote 176 entrepreneurial and employment opportunities and (ii) conducting other activities useful in carrying out 177 the provisions of this article.

178 The board of directors of any such corporation shall be composed of the chairman of the Foundation
179 and eight persons appointed by the Foundation. The terms of the members of any corporation
180 established shall be four years.

**181** The Foundation shall require any such corporation to report to it at least annually on its activities.

**182** § 2.2-2737. Staffing.

183 The Department of Housing and Community Development shall provide additional staff support to
 184 the Foundation. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Foundation, upon
 185 request.

186 2. That as of July 1, 2011, the Southwest Virginia Cultural Heritage Foundation shall be deemed 187 successor in interest to the Southwest Virginia Cultural Heritage Commission to the extent that 188 this act transfers powers and duties. All right, title, and interest in and to any real or tangible 189 personal property vested in the Southwest Virginia Cultural Heritage Commission to the extent 190 that this act transfers powers and duties as of July 1, 2011, shall be transferred to and taken as 191 standing in the name of the Southwest Virginia Cultural Heritage Foundation.

192 3. That the Governor may transfer an appropriation or any portion thereof within a state agency 193 established, abolished or otherwise affected by the provisions of this act or from one such agency

194 to another to support the changes in organization or responsibility resulting from or required by

195 this act.

196 4. That any individual serving a term as a commissioner of the Southwest Virginia Cultural

197 Heritage Commission in accordance with the provisions of former § 2.2-2533 of the Code of 198 Virginia shall continue his term of office as a member of the board of trustees of the Southwest

199 Virginia Cultural Heritage Foundation on July 1, 2011.
