10 11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That § 28.2-603 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 28.2-603. General oyster planting grounds.
13	A. Waterfront that is not already assigned or reserved for the riparian owners, and the beds of the
14	bays, rivers, and creeks and shores of the sea lying outside the limits of navigation projects adopted and
15	authorized by the Congress and not required for the disposal of materials dredged incident to the
16	maintenance of such projects, and grounds other than public oyster beds, rocks, or shoals, as defined by
17	law and included in the Baylor survey, may be occupied for the purpose of planting or propagating
18	oysters, including the use of temporary protective enclosures in compliance with this chapter and
19	Commission regulations, and may be leased by the Commissioner upon the receipt of a proper
20	application.
21	B. The Commission shall establish commercial shellfish aquaculture opportunity zones for the
22	placement of temporary protective enclosures as set forth in § 28.2-603.1, in the waters off the shores of
23	the Northern Neck, the Middle Peninsula, and Tangier Island. Such zones shall be established by
24	regulations. The regulations shall prescribe (i) the location of such zones; (ii) the proper procedures for the maintenance of such zones including the (a) proper placement and hendling of seer and other
25 26	the maintenance of such zones, including the (a) proper placement and handling of gear and other apparatus so as not to create a safety hazard and (b) seasonal and time-of-day use of such zones; and
20 27	(iii) penalties for violations of the regulations. Once established, such zones shall be exempt from the
28	provisions of $\frac{8}{28.2-606}$, $\frac{28.2-607}{28.2-607}$, and $\frac{28.2-608}{28.2-612}$ through $\frac{28.2-615}{28.2-615}$, and $\frac{28.2-617}{28.2-617}$. The

Commission may establish a single fee for the application and use of the aquaculture opportunity zones. **2**9
