6 WHEREAS, United States Army Specialist Brian Michael Anderson of Harrisonburg was killed in 7 action on June 12, 2010, while serving in Afghanistan; and WHEREAS, Brian "Bucky" Anderson was born on March 5, 1986, to loving parents Margaret and 8 9 Kenny Anderson and was one of three siblings; and WHEREAS, an active and strong young man, Bucky Anderson was a two-time state wrestling 10 champion and three-year starter on the football team at Broadway High School before graduating in 11 2004; he went on to wrestle at James Madison University for the 2004 and 2005 teams; and 12 13 WHEREAS, Bucky Anderson joined the United States Army in 2008 and was a member of the 1st 14 Battalion, 87th Infantry Regiment, 1st Brigade Combat Team, 10th Mountain Division based in Fort 15 Drum, New York; and WHEREAS, an outstanding soldier, Specialist Anderson had been stationed in Afghanistan for three 16 17 months when the vehicle he was in hit an improvised explosive device; and WHEREAS, respected by his colleagues and superiors, Specialist Anderson received many awards 18 19 and accolades for his exemplary service, including the National Defense Service Medal, the Afghanistan Campaign Medal, the Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, the Army Service Ribbon, and the 20 21 Overseas Service Ribbon; and 22 WHEREAS, Specialist Anderson had a jovial personality that endeared him to others; he had many 23 friends and admirers throughout his life and was known for his positive attitude and work ethic while 24 serving his country; and 25 WHEREAS, Bucky Anderson will be fondly remembered and greatly missed by his parents, 26 Margaret and Kenny; brother, Andy; sister, Jenny; his numerous other family members and friends; and 27 his comrades; and 28 WHEREAS, Specialist Anderson's death is a reminder of the perils faced daily by the thousands of 29 Americans who serve in our armed forces overseas and whose devotion to duty places them in harm's 30 way; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly hereby note with great sadness the loss of a courageous and patriotic Virginian, Specialist Brian Michael 31 32 33 Anderson; and, be it 34 RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the Senate prepare a copy of this resolution for 35 presentation to the family of Specialist Brian Michael Anderson as an expression of the General
