Chamber of Commerce, as a director on the boards of the Wolf Trap Foundation for the Performing
Arts and YMCA of Metropolitan Washington, D.C., and as a founder and past board chair of the
Northern Virginia Chapter of the National Association of Industrial and Office Properties; and

WHEREAS, Karen Connell Cleveland has served in many roles to build a sense of community in
 Reston with her unique understanding of the power of sector collaboration in creating a thriving
 community; and

WHEREAS, Karen Connell Cleveland served as executive director of the Greater Reston Chamber of
Commerce from 1988-1995, when she was instrumental in forging a partnership with Reston Interfaith
to create the Best of Reston, an event now in its 20th year; she now serves on the board of directors for

 and youth as a member and generous supporter of the Fairfax County YMCA, Reston Soccer
 Association, Reston Youth Baseball, and Pit Teen Center; and
