**4. Title:** Schedule II, III, or IV controlled substances; request and review information about patient

**5. Summary:** Requires any prescriber of a controlled substance included in Schedule II, Schedule III, or Schedule IV of the Drug Control Act to request and review information about that patient from the Prescription Monitoring Program, and to continue to do so at least annually for so long as the prescriber continues to prescribe the controlled substance to the patient.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** The proposed legislation will increase queries to Prescription Monitoring Program. However, since all queries are handled electronically (around the clock access), the increased program utilization will not necessitate additional staff or resources. The Prescription Monitoring Program is funded by an endowment without any support from the general fund practitioner fee revenue.
