Summary: Allows localities to establish enhanced enforcement areas in any area in which the governing body determines the conduct of prostitutes and those that solicit prostitutes establishes a concern for the health, safety, good order, and morals of the general public. Violations of the enhanced enforcement area restrictions are not to constitute greater than a Class 1 misdemeanor.

Fiscal Implications: Although insufficient data exists to determine the fiscal impact resulting from the proposal at this time, the legislation could result in an increase in the jail population since Class 1 misdemeanor outcomes result in sentences of up to 12 months in jail (and up to a \$2,500 fine). Any increase in the jail population will increase costs to the state. The Commonwealth presently pays the localities \$4.00 a day for each misdemeanant or otherwise local responsible prisoner held in a jail. It also funds most of the jails' operating costs, e.g. correctional officers. The state's share of these costs on a per prisoner, per day basis varies from locality to locality. However, according to the Compensation Board's FY2009 Jail Cost Report (November 1, 2010), the estimated state support for local and regional jails averaged \$33.01 per state inmate, per day in FY 2009.
