4. Title: Statewide Fire Prevention Code; permissible fireworks.

5. Summary: The proposed legislation amends the Code of Virginia related to permissible fireworks and the regulation of such fireworks.

The bill redefines what constitutes permissible fireworks in Virginia. The bill also sets out the authority of local governments to regulate permissible fireworks.

Further, the bill provides that the storage and sale of permissible fireworks shall be governed solely by the Code for the Manufacture, Transportation, Storage, and Retail Sale of Fireworks and Pyrotechnic Articles adopted by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA 1124, 2006 Edition).

8. Fiscal Implications: The bill redefines the types of fireworks which are permissible in Virginia. It is anticipated that the changes will increase the number of complaints and consultative calls that the State Fire Marshal's Office (SFMO) must respond to. Given recent budget reductions in the Department of Fire Programs, the SFMO does not currently possess sufficient staff to respond to the increase in calls. The expenditure impact of \$53,000 per year equates to increasing an existing wage employee's hours to 1300 per year and hiring and additional wage employee, plus additional fuel costs for existing staff to respond to the

complaints. The Department of Fire Programs does not have sufficient funding to cover these additional costs.
