4. Title: Military laws of Virginia.

5. Summary: Makes several amendments to the military laws of the Commonwealth. Many of the changes are technical, such as updating references to the Virginia State Guard and Virginia State Defense Force to the Virginia Defense Force and deleting obsolete references. The bill also makes amendments to the appointment of officers of the National Guard, nonjudicial punishment, failure to attend training, and special courts-martial.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Final (Indeterminate - see Item #8)

8. Fiscal Implications: This legislation is primarily technical in nature; however, there is the potential for a fiscal impact. Language was added to § 44-88 of the Code of Virginia entitling members of the Virginia Defense Force who are called to state active duty to receive the same pay, rations, and allowances as persons of like grade in the United States Armed Forces. Due to the various situations in which Virginia Defense Force personnel could be called to state active duty, it is not possible to quantify the fiscal impact. Currently, there are 1,072 members of the Virginia Defense Force; however, it is unlikely that all Virginia Defense Force personnel would be mobilized at the same time.
