**4. Title:** Child day programs; exemption from licensure requirements

**5. Summary:** The enrolled bill clarifies that a child day program that, by written policy given to and signed by a parent or guardian, school-aged children are free to enter and leave the premises without permission or supervision shall be exempt from licensure requirements regardless of (i) such program's location or the number of days per week of its operation; (ii) the provision of transportation services, including drop-off and pick-up times; or (iii) the scheduling of breaks for snacks, homework, or other activities.
