3. Committee: Education and Health

4. Title: Open enrollment policies; local school divisions.

5. Summary: Allows local school divisions to develop policies that provide for the open enrollment to any school of any pupil residing within the school division upon the request of a parent or guardian and pursuant to certain conditions and limitations.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary. See item 8.

8. Fiscal Implications: This bill permits local school divisions to establish and implement open enrollment policies allowing students to attend any school within the school division in which the student resides. School divisions may also adopt the policies with inclusion of certain conditions and limitations.

Since changes are not being made to how school divisions are funded and no students would attend a school outside the division in which they reside as a result of this bill, there would be no state fiscal impact. However, it is anticipated that this legislation could result in additional administrative costs for local school divisions to coordinate the enrollment of students in a school outside the attendance area in which they reside; however, it is assumed that any such costs would be absorbed within current local resources.
